# SRLLANKA's war on terror

The battle against one of the most brutal terrorist organizations in the world – the Tamil Tigers



After more than a quarter century of atrocities committed by one of the most violent terrorist organizations in the world — the Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE or the Tamil Tigers) — in 2009, the Sri Lankan government, with active support from the international community, achieved what few other countries in recent history can claim: putting an end to a bloody separatist and terrorist organization and bringing peace to the nation. Much of the world is relieved to see the long suffering of ordinary Sri Lankans end, and today, Sri Lanka has emerged as the fastest growing economy in South Asia, outpacing all its neighbors, including India.

#### Thirty Years of Human Rights Atrocities by the Tamil Tigers

The pioneers of the suicide vest, the Tamil Tigers were the first terrorist masterminds to <u>use women and children for suicide bombings</u>. Considered one of the most brutal terrorist organizations in the world, the LTTE was declared a <u>terrorist organization by 32 countries</u>, including the United States, the European Union, Canada and India.

The Tamil Tigers possessed a well-developed militia and carried out high-profile attacks both in Sri Lanka and abroad. They are the only militant group to assassinate two world leaders: Sri Lankan President Ranasinghe Premadasa in 1993 and former Indian Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in 1991.

At its core, the LTTE was a <u>separatist organization</u> and controlled much of Sri Lanka's northern territories. Their sympathizers, who represented less



than 5 percent of Sri Lanka, inherently opposed Sri Lanka and wanted their own Tamil state, independent from the country's Buddhist, Hindu, Muslim and Christian population.

Over a 30-year period, the Tamil Tigers <u>killed more than 100,000 people</u> in Sri Lanka, including more than 8,000 fellow Tamils who they punished for being traitors for not following their radical militant ideology. They <u>trampled upon the human rights of ordinary Sri Lankans</u>, mostly the majority Sinhalese

population, by committing mass rapes and torture. They forcibly enlisted young boys and girls from the Tamil population to join the war and used innocent citizens as shields to protect themselves from their own violence. It would be hard to find a single family in Sri Lanka that hasn't lost a loved one to their brutality.



In 2009, after nearly three decades of mass atrocities against the human rights of ordinary Sri Lankans, the government of Sri Lanka defeated the Tamil Tigers and eradicated terrorism from its own soil. However, LTTE sympathizers, who still vie for a separate breakaway Tamil state from Sri Lanka, continue to thrive outside Sri Lanka under various names and organizations.


#### The Final Phase Ending the War

After nearly three decades of terrorism, failed ceasefire treaties and mass atrocities by the Tamil Tigers, the government of Sri Lanka resolved to end its people's misery and launched an overpowering military offensive humanitarian operation against the Tamil Tigers. The government received international support for its efforts, including from the U.S. administration that provided political, military and other strategic support to help defeat the terrorists.

In 2006, a year after President Mahinda Rajapaksa took office, the Tamil Tigers in the Mavil Aru area in the eastern region of the country cut off the water supply used for drinking, agriculture and livelihood for nearly 50,000 people. This triggered the government's decision to send in national security forces for a fresh military offensive to free the area of the Tamil Tigers. The security forces succeeded in this operation and strengthened their protection to the strategically important Trincomalee Harbour. By July 2007, the forces liberated much of the Eastern Province from the grip of Tamil Tigers.

This success allowed the security forces to launch a major operation to free the northern region of the island from the Tamil Tigers' control. The government increased manpower, weapons and supplies for the security forces, raising the morale of the forces and leading them to repeated successes against the Tamil Tigers over the course of two years. By early 2009, the armed forces advanced significantly in the northern region, defeating the Tamil Tigers in their strongholds of Pooneryn, Kilinochchi, Elephant Pass and Mullaitivu.

However, in the final stages of the battle in May 2009, the Tamil Tigers demonstrated their ruthless nature by holding nearly 350,000 civilians as human shields, and later as hostages, for the protection of the Tigers leadership that was expecting to escape. At the time, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC) requested and received the government's and the LTTE's permission to go in and provide relief support to the hostages. However, despite their assurances, the Tamil Tigers came in and starting shooting indiscriminately and killing both hostages as well as ICRC representatives.



At that moment, the government and the armed forces were pressed to make a swift decision on how to rescue the hostages. Ascertaining the situation at the time the security forces, with the government's approval, moved in and managed to rescue most of the people. Unfortunately, there was collateral damage during the operation that is determined to be approximately 4,600 casualties. But based on their intelligence, the government had reason to believe that if the security forces did not proceed with the rescue operation, the loss of innocent lives would have been significantly greater.

The then-U.S. ambassador, British High Commissioner, Indian ambassador and others were situated at the Sri Lankan Air Force headquarters to watch the final phase of the military operation live via UAV footage.

#### **Rebuilding Sri Lanka**

In the past five years since the minimization of terrorism, Sri Lanka has launched a massive impetus to increase the nation's economic growth. Large infrastructure development projects have been initiated such as the development and expansion of thermal and hydro power plants, ports, expressways and harbors. Today, the country's economic growth outperforms all its South Asia neighbors, and the country now ranks as the top South Asian nation to do business with in the World Bank's 2014 Doing Business Report.

#### The New Sri Lanka

- Growth rate 7.3 percent, outperforming all South Asian neighbors
- Growth rate in the North 23.8 percent Inflation rate fallen from 6.7 to 3.2 percent
- Unemployment rate fallen over the last decade from 9 to 4 percent
- 90 percent of households have electricity
- Tourism almost doubled in the last five years
- World Bank's 2014 Doing Business Report ranks Sri Lanka as the top South Asian nation for business

At the same time, the government has also taken steps to bring the former LTTE-controlled territories to be part of mainstream Sri Lanka. After the war ended, the government put its energies behind basic humanitarian needs for the survivors and spent more than \$4 billion in livelihood, schools, health, and transportation and infrastructure efforts in the region. Today, the economic growth in the northern, mostly Tamil region once devastated by the war stands at 23.8 percent.

For 40 years, not a single election was conducted in the northern region, so the government undertook measures to restore the right of franchise to the people and successfully held two elections — local and provincial. The Northern Province now has stable governing bodies led by the Tamil National Alliance. The government made an important commitment and has since resettled most of the nearly 300,000 internally displaced people (IDP) in the North under a resettlement and rehabilitation program. There are still some IDPs that need to be resettled, as they do not have any land – the government is presently working with the UN Refugees Agency to manage this. Additionally, the government has made efforts to reintroduce children forced to serve as LTTE soldiers into society, as well as 11,872 ex-combatants, within the first three months of peace.

In May 2010, the government created an independent Lessons Learnt and Reconciliation Commission (LLRC) to study the cause of the conflict and action required to achieve post war reconciliation. After an 18-month inquiry, the LLRC made 185 recommendations, which were submitted to the parliament in 2011. The reconciliation and accountability process is currently underway.

The Missing Person's Commission has now already received <u>more than 20,000 submissions</u> and also recently written to the government of Sri Lanka asking for tactical assistance. The government is in the process of identifying internationally reputed personnel with extensive experience in this field. Certain eminent personalities have already been appointed.

#### **SRI LANKA'S WAR ON TERROR - Timeline of Events**

1948	The nation of Ceylon becomes independent from British rule.
May 1972	Ceylon becomes the Independent and Democratic Republic of Sri Lanka, where a majority of its population is Buddhist Sinhalese. The Hindu Tamils becomes the largest minority group in the country.
1976	Liberation Tigers of Tamil Eelam (LTTE), an ethnic terrorist group fighting for what they called "Eelam," a separate Tamil state, is formed. LTTE is fated to become one of the most dangerous terrorist groups in the world.
1981	After five years of brutality, the Sri Lankan government is forced to impose a state of emergency on the country to quell riots between Sinhalese and Tamils.
1983	The Tamil Tigers launch several guerrilla attacks, killing 13 Sri Lankan soldiers, which sparks the First Eelam War.
1987	In an attempt to create unity and peace after years of war, India drafts and implements an agreement with the Sri Lankan government to deploy Indian peace-keeping forces. The Tamil Tigers refuse to disarm.
1990	After three years of fighting with the Tamil Tigers, which ultimately kills 1,000 Indian peace keepers, India withdraws its remaining support. The Second Eelam War begins.
May 1991	A Tamil Tigers suicide bomber assassinates former Indian Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi and 14 bystanders during a campaign rally prior to India's parliamentary elections.
May 1993	Sri Lankan President Ranasinghe Premadasa is assassinated by a Tamil Tigers suicide bomber during a May Day rally, which also kills most of the President's bodyguards and close aides and wounds dozens of civilians and government officials.
Nov. 1994	President Chandrika Kumaratunga comes to power, pledging to end the war and opening peace talks with the Tamil Tigers.
April 1995	Peace talks fail when Tamil Tigers commandos sink two gunboats and declare end to a 14-week cease-fire, propelling Sri Lanka into the Third Eelam War.
1995-2001	The Tamil Tigers step up their attacks with ambushes, oil-depot explosions and wholesale massacres of villages. They execute bombings at Sri Lanka's holiest Buddhist site, central bank and international airport and ultimately wound President Kumaratunga during one such attack. Recognizing the 15 years of brutality the Tamil Tigers, the U.S. Department of State designates the Tamil Tigers as a foreign terrorist organization in October of 1997.
2002	In yet another attempt to secure peace and safety for its citizens, the Sri Lankan government signs a Norwegian-mediated ceasefire agreement with the Tamil Tigers.

2003	The Tamil Tigers pull out of peace talks, however the ceasefire holds.
2005	Continuing the violence, the Tamil Tigers attack and kill 45 Sri Lankan soldiers, sailors and policemen.
2006	<b>During the Fourth Eelam War</b> , the Tamil Tigers in Mavil Aru cut off water used for drinking, agriculture and livelihood for nearly 50,000 people in the East, forcing President Rajapaksa to use national security forces to free the area.
January 2008	The Tamil Tigers escalate the war by bombing a military bus. In response, Sri Lanka officially withdraws from the truce and is forced to launch a military offensive.
January 2009	Sri Lankan troops capture the town of Killinochchi, the Tamil Tigers' administrative headquarters.
April 2009	The Sri Lankan government sets a 24 hour deadline for the Tamil Tigers rebels to surrender after they take nearly 350,000 civilians as human shields.
May 2009	During the last battle of the war, as the army captures the last area of rebel-held territory in northern Sri Lanka, Tamil Tigers leader Velupillai Prabhakaran is killed. After decades of terrorism and tens of thousands of deaths, Tamil Tigers concede defeat and agree to lay down their arms.
	The Sri Lankan government officially declares the conflict ended and begins a period of peace and reconciliation.

#### **Biography**

The Honorable Sajin de Vass Gunawardena serves as Coordinating Secretary to Sri Lanka's President Mahinda Rajapaksa and as the External Affairs Ministry's Monitoring Member of Parliament. In his role, he is the official conduit between the President and the country's foreign ministry on all matters relating to trade and foreign relations. He is one of the senior members of the government. Mr. Gunawardena is also a member of the United People's Freedom Alliance (UPFA).

Shortly after President Rajapaksa was re-elected for his second term in 2010, Mr. Gunawardena was elected to Parliament, representing his native Galle district in Southern Sri Lanka. In addition to his role in the Rajapaksa administration, Mr. Gunawardena leads the Parliament's foreign relations efforts and also sits on several Consultative Committees, including: Petroleum Industries, Economic Development, Higher Education, Civil Aviation, Defense and Urban Development. Prior to his position in Parliament, Mr. Gunawardena was elected to the Southern Provincial Council in 2004 as Provincial Councilor in the coastal city Ambalangoda.

He is the former CEO of Mihin Lanka, a low-fare, state-owned airline. He originally began his career in the shipping industry at Hayleys, NYK Shipping Lines' maritime agency, before moving to Evergreen Shipping Lines and Trico International in Dubai.

Mr. Gunawardena was educated at the Royal College of Colombo. He currently resides in Colombo with his wife and two sons.

#### Human Rights in Sri Lanka

Sri Lanka's documented civilization goes back at least 2,600 years. Over the centuries, Sri Lanka has been home to people from diverse ethnicities, languages and religions. Ever since its ancient history, Sri Lanka has valued its traditions that valued equality and promoted human rights: Sri Lanka was the first Asian country known to have a female ruler, Queen Anula (47–42 BC); it was also the first country in the world to establish a dedicated hospital in Mihintale in the 4th century.

Sri Lanka's modern period is marked by the Colebrooke-Cameron reforms of 1833, which led to the introduction of a utilitarian and liberal political culture based on the rule of law and establishment of an Executive Council and Legislative Council. This later became the foundation of representative legislature in the country. These reforms also led to the modernizing of Sri Lanka's economic system and a public school model for education.

Sri Lanka has enjoyed uninterrupted democracy, including universal suffrage, since 1931. The country has been proud of its achievements in areas such as education — it has the highest literacy rates in South Asia, with nearly 99 percent for women — diversity, strong civil society and media, and religious freedoms.

But Sri Lanka also recognizes that nearly three decades of brutal terrorism was a significant setback for its human rights progress. The wreckage caused by the Tamil Tigers' terror — where more than 100,000 Sri Lankans (one half of one percent of its entire population) were killed and countless more were raped, maimed and tortured — will take time to heal.

After successfully ending terrorism in 2009, Sri Lanka restored the greatest human right — the right to life — and began its journey toward peace and prosperity. Today, the people of Sri Lanka are working hard to rebuild an inclusive society and restore human rights to their people.

Their journey has just begun. The country recognizes that a lot needs to be done to restore its human rights and bring the country back to its original trajectory. As a start, the following areas have seen significant great strides since 2009:

- Improving health conditions
- Strengthening women's rights
- Increasing freedom of the press
- Healing the wounds of war

#### Improving health conditions

Over the past decade, life expectancy in Sri Lanka has increased by nearly four years and the country has been elevated to "high" in the United Nation Development Program's Human Development Index. Further, according to the World Bank, both the maternal mortality rate and the infant mortality rate in Sri Lanka are well below .01 percent – well ahead of Sri Lanka's regional peers.

This is largely due not only to the onset of peace after many years of war, but the improved living conditions within the country, as well. For instance:

- Today, nearly 90 percent of all households have electricity.
- Water and sanitation facilities have been upgraded to UNICEF/CFS standards in 6,000 primary schools.
- Social Care Centers in the North and East have been created to provide integrated and ongoing care to the vulnerable.
- Nearly 32,000 disabled persons in two provinces alone were provided with assistance devices such as wheel chairs, crutches, eye glasses and other medical devices.
- Government Mobile Services issued Elder Identity Cards to more than 13,000 senior citizens in the North and East so they may benefit from priority health and other treatment and financial benefits.
- Nearly 4,000 households in the North and East with disabled family members have been given monthly cash allowances to help secure healthy standards of living.

According to a UNICEF report (link to report) "Improving Children's Lives, Transforming the Future – 25 years of child rights in South Asia," Sri Lanka's efforts to establish children's legally enforceable rights to health, education, protection and participation has significantly improved children's health and living conditions.

#### Strengthening women's rights

History shows that prior to the end of Sri Lanka's war on terrorism, the country enjoyed a long-standing history of equality for women. With universal suffrage since 1931, women are active participants in the operation of the government. The UK-based newspaper The Independent in 2012 called Sri Lanka the best place for a woman to be head of state. Also in 2012, the World Economic Forum's Gender Gap Report ranked Sri Lanka 22<sup>nd</sup> in the world for political empowerment of women.

The country also boasts an exceptional education rate for women. With nearly a 99 percent literacy rates among women, 72.6 percent of Sri Lanka's female population has access to secondary education, compared to 75.5 percent of males. And, since Sri Lanka's battle with the Tamil Tigers ended, women widowed by the fighting have been provided with vocational trainings and other courses as part of public livelihood programs.

#### Increasing freedom of the press

Sri Lanka stands for a free and fair press, unencumbered by government restrictions. Freedom of expression is a core tenet of democracy and Sri Lanka's government categorically supports it. The diversity of media coverage, including ongoing criticism of the government, is evidence of such freedoms; as is the fact that more than 90 percent of the media in Sri Lanka is affiliated with those in opposition to the current ruling political party — with more publications being bought by opposition leaders. The other approximate 10 percent is made up of three publicly owned, government-supported newspapers and two public television stations, similar to NPR and PBS in the United States.

At the same time, the wounds of a quarter century of brutal terrorism are still fresh in the country and the government will not allow political actors or supposed NGOs that are attempting to destabilize the nation to hide under the protection of journalists.

#### Healing the Wounds of War

Sri Lanka continues to work toward healing the wounds of war and rehabilitating ex-combatants. Some areas in which the government has made significant progress include:

Rehabilitating survivors – After the war, Sri Lanka had more than 300,000 internally displaced Tamil civilians whose situation needed to be immediately addressed. The government decided that in was in its people's best interest to first put its energy behind helping survivors, looking after their basic humanitarian needs — livelihood, schools, health, roads and infrastructure — and eventually their rehabilitation by helping their families rebuild their lives. Sri Lanka set up rehabilitation centers to provide artificial limbs and monthly allowances for those who were disabled during the fighting, as well as counseling and health clinics for the entire community.

Other aspects of the rehabilitation process that the government initiated include professional training courses in areas such as mechanical skills, IT, agriculture, food processing, carpentry and health clinics. In total, the government has spent more than \$4 billion on infrastructure, investment, jobs, education and early childhood development, health initiatives and commercial enhancements to the North.

As of April 2014, 58,122 damaged houses were reconstructed and 24,402 partly damaged houses have been renovated with the assistance of the government, UN agencies, INGOs and NGOs. Also, 22,473 fully-damaged houses continue to be rebuilt today, with another 237 houses under renovations. An additional 50,000 houses are being built in war-ravaged areas with the help of the Indian government.

Voluntary return of Sri Lankan refugees has been encouraged via cash packages, as well as education through booklets and videos on available assistance to returning refugees. Also, nearly 6,400 plots of land have been set aside to facilitate resettlement for the displaced Muslim communities.

- Rebuilding democracy in the North For 40 years, Sri Lanka's Northern region, where most of the
  fighting took place, did not hold a single election. Since 2009 however, the government has held two
  elections in the region, allowing a local, stable governing body led by the Tamil National Alliance.
  There was also no census or statistics done in the region for 45 years. The government started that
  process.
- 3. <u>Humanely handling prisoners</u> All persons arrested following the war were duly processed before a magistrate in a timely manner; they had their arrests communicated with relatives and their families were allowed visitation rights. For those arrested under the Prevention of Terrorism Act, a database of detainees is available at Terrorism Investigation Units across the country. Changes to detention of Prevention of Terrorism Act detainees were promptly communicated to human rights agencies and to the next of kin.
- 4. Reintegrating Tamil combatants Within just one year, all 594 child soldiers forced to fight on behalf of the Tamil Tigers were rehabilitated and reunited with their families. In total, 11,872 children and adults have been reintroduced into society, with only 171 remaining under legal proceedings.
- 5. <u>Massive economic development</u> Like the U.S. Marshall Plan following World War II, Sri Lanka recognized it was the war-torn areas that needed the most help. Railway lines, water treatment

facilities, schools, hospitals – anything to improve growth to those that need it most – are being built in the North. The war-torn region is witnessing a remarkable 23.8 percent growth, whereas the country has witnessed an average seven percent GDP growth rate in the last five years.

- 6. Settling Land Issues Mediation Boards in the areas where armed conflicts prevailed are actively addressing land disputes. The country is now undergoing the complicated process of identifying ownership and rights in collaboration with the community and trying to overcome the challenge of registries burned down by the Tamil Tigers. An education program in both simple Tamil and Sinhala languages is underway to help displaced persons come forward to benefit from the Land Policy and the Associated Programme. The program seeks to make available land to all returning IDPs as expeditiously as possible.
- 7. <u>Police issues</u> Community policing is conducted through 422 units set up in every main police station throughout the country. More than 3,600 police officers have been trained under an ongoing project initiated by the Scottish Police College. Sixteen new police stations have been set up, and 1,450 Tamil speaking police officers serve the public in these areas. Complaints by the public against police officers regarding misconduct or similar deeds are rigorously monitored. Human Rights Education training is routinely provided to police officers.
- 8. Accountability and reconciliation In May 2010, a year after the final phase of the war, the government created an independent Lessons Learnt and Reconciliation Commission (LLRC) to study the cause of the conflict and action required to achieve post war reconciliation. After an 18-month inquiry, the LLRC made 185 recommendations, which were submitted to the parliament in 2011. The reconciliation and accountability process is currently underway.

The government has also set up an independent commission to look into the cases of alleged disappearances in the Northern and Eastern Provinces over a 26 year period between 1983 and 2009. The commission has gone village by village and received more than 20,000 submissions of disappearances in all three categories: by LTTE, by military and unknown. This process is currently ongoing.

#### Summary of Implementation of LLRC Recommendations Select Highlights

#### **Human Rights**

- Of the complaints of disappearances received to date, 2,544 have been investigated and 380 additional cases are being reviewed by the Terrorist Investigation Division.
- In August 2013, a Presidential Commission of Inquiry was created to investigate alleged disappearances. To date, 18,590 complaints have been received, including approximately 5,000 relatives of missing security forces personnel.
- Families of arrested relatives are allowed to visit them in places of detention and all arrested persons are duly processed before a magistrate in a timely manner.
- Those who are arrested fall under the Prevention of Terrorism Act and a magistrate visits detention centers each month. Any change of place of detention is promptly communicated to next of kin and Human Rights Agencies.
- A database of detainees is available for access by next of kin at the Terrorist Investigation Units in Colombo, Vavuniya and Boosa.
- District Secretaries are taking action to ensure that religious and community leaders are assured freedom to organize and hold peaceful meetings.

#### Rehabilitation

- A total of 11,872 individuals have been rehabilitated and reintegrated into society (9,598 men; 2,274 women).
   Only 171 remain under legal proceedings.
- All 594 child combatants were rehabilitated and reunited with families within a one year period.
- Rehabilitation centers are providing artificial limbs and monthly allowances for those who are disabled. Other services include counseling programs and health clinics.
- The rehabilitation process includes professional training courses in areas including mechanical skills, IT, agriculture, food processing, carpentry and construction.

#### **Resettling Refugees & Land Policy**

- Voluntary return of Sri Lankan refugees has been encouraged via cash packages, as well as education through booklets and videos on available assistance to returning refugees.
- Nearly 6,400 plots of land have been set aside to facilitate resettlement for Muslim IDPs.
- An education program in simple Tamil and Sinhala language is underway to help displaced persons
  come forward to benefit from the Land Policy and the Associated Programme. The program seeks to
  make available land to all returning IDPs as expeditiously as possible.

#### **Programs for Women and Children**

- Widowed women have been provided with vocational and other trainings on livelihood programs.
- The National Counseling Center is offering mental health counseling to children who suffer from trauma to improve and promote social reintegration and reduce school drop-out rates.

#### Infrastructure/Land Return/Resettlement

- Water and sanitation facilities were upgraded in 6,000 primary schools to bring up to UNICEF/CFS standards.
- By April 2014, 58,122 damaged houses were reconstructed and 24,402 partly damaged houses have been renovated with the assistance of the government, <u>UN agencies</u>, <u>INGOs and NGOs</u>. Currently 22,473 fully damaged houses are being reconstructed and 237 houses are being renovated.
- Mediation Boards in areas where armed conflicts prevailed are actively addressing land disputes.
   This is a complicated issue, as registries were burned down by the Tamil Tigers. We are now in the process of identifying ownership and perception rights in collaboration with the society.
- Government Mobile Services have issued Elder's Identity Cards to more than 13,000 senior citizens
  in the North and East so they may enjoy priority treatment at public and private institutions and be
  entitled to financial benefits.
- Nearly 4,000 families in the North and East with a disabled family member, receive monthly cash allowance. Nearly 32,000 disabled persons in two provinces were provided with assistive devices including chairs, crutches and spectacles.
- Twenty-seven Sports Training and Coaching Camps had been established in districts of Northern and Eastern Provinces during the first quarter of 2014.
- 50,000 houses are being built in the war-ravaged areas with the help of the Indian government; 28,000 have been completed with the balance set to be finished by 2016.

#### **Family Assistance**

- The National Counseling Center provides preventive and treatment counseling to single parents in the Northern Province to improve mental health and promote social integration, reduce school drop-out rates and reduce domestic violence and crime.
- Social Care Centers operate in the North and East to provide integrated social care as a safety net to the vulnerable. The Ministry of Social Services, in collaboration with UNICEF provides financial support and other assistance too families in the North and East.

#### **Police**

- Community policing is conducted through 422 units set up in every main police station throughout
  the country. More than 3,600 police officers have been trained under an ongoing project initiated
  by the Scottish Police College. Sixteen new police stations have been set up, and 1,450 Tamil

The Tamil Tigers carried out attacks on civilian targets throughout Sri Lanka using human bombs, vehicle bombs, time bombs, claymore mines, different Improvised Explosive Devices (IEDs) and other armed attacks. The <u>attacks on innocent civilians</u> using these methods killed more than 9,800 and grievously injured more than 10,000 in Government-controlled areas. 
Your August 22 editorial, "Sri Lanka's Intransigence" makes insensitive assertions about my country, which has enjoyed uninterrupted democracy since 1931. September 2013 witnessed the first ever election to the Northern Provincial Council – delayed by over two decades as a result of the Tamil Tigers' refusal to politically empower people in the North. Today the Tamil National Alliance is in control of Provincial administration. To compare Sri Lanka with human rights and humanitarian emergencies elsewhere in the world is unconscionable.

We reject the investigation led by the UN Human Rights High Commissioner because its intrusive nature exceeds its mandate; it challenges the sovereignty of our country, violates basic principles of international law, vitiates the atmosphere needed for reconciliation, and ignores substantial and progressive socio-economic and political progress already achieved, including the resettlement of 300,000 displaced people and rehabilitation of 11,000 terrorists.

The three-decade long conflict with many failed attempts at peace due to LTTE intransigence affected the whole country. Local accountability mechanisms, now strengthened with international experts – former UN war crimes prosecutor Sir Desmond de Silva, former Yugoslavia criminal tribunal official Sir Geoffrey Nice, former Sierra Leone special court chief prosecutor Prof. David M. Crane – are respectful of inherent social, cultural and ethnic susceptibilities, unlike the UN-driven process that serves externally motivated interests and will destabilize the intricate balance of the national reconciliation process.



## Rebuilding SRI LANKA



In the past five years since the eradication of terrorism, Sri Lanka has witnessed tremendous growth and stability in economic, political and social fronts, as well as in the area of resettlement and rehabilitation of the displaced and the marginalized communities in the northern belt that was once controlled by the Tamil Tigers. The government focused its energies behind basic humanitarian needs of the affected people and has spent more than \$4 billion in infrastructure, investment, jobs, education and early childhood development, health initiatives, transportation and energy infrastructure, and commercial enhancements in the northern region.



#### **Notable Projects**

Sri Lanka launched a massive nationwide impetus to increase its economic growth. Notable projects initiated over the last five years include:

- Completed infrastructure projects in recent years, including the Magama Ruhunupura Mahinda Rajapaksa Port, Norochcholai thermal power plant, Upper Kotmale hydro power plant, the Colombo-Katunayake expressway the Southern expressway, and expansion of Colombo harbor.
- Resumed train travel, after 23 years, between Omanthai Railway Station and Kilinochchi Railway Station in the North by reconstructing 63 kilometers of track and improving opportunities in the region.

- · Launched Jaffna and Kilinochchi Water Supply and Sanitation project aimed to provide fresh drinkable water in the North.
- Created the Northern Road Connectivity Project, which rehabilitated 170 kilometers of roads in the North and the East, improving the transportation system of the island while and providing economic growth and stability in the formerly war-torn North.
- Reconstructed the Iranamadu Runway in the North, which had been destroyed by the Tamils at the end of the war. The domestic runway promoted domestic aviation and provides access to the North, boosting tourism.
- Invested in banking and credit facilities in rural areas and provided substantial fertilizer subsidies.
- Opened nearly 700 Information Technology (IT) centers in rural or semi-rural
- Expanded of agriculture and fisheries throughout the country.
- Promoted tourism in the North for both foreigner and domestic markets.

#### **Macroeconomic Progress**

- Sri Lanka's growth outperformed all its South Asian neighbors at 7.3 percent GDP growth in 2013.
- · The World Bank's 2014 Doing Business Report ranks Sri Lanka as the top South Asian nation for business.
- Inflation has fallen to 3.2 percent from 6.7 percent; and Debt-to-GDP has steadily fallen since 2009, from 86.2 percent to 78.3 percent in 2013 and projected 65 percent by 2016.
- · Fitch Ratings and Standard & Poor's have maintained their credit ratings, BB- and B+ respectively, citing strong growth prospects. Fitch was encouraged by Sri Lanka's growing national economy and strong payment record, while S&P cited its progress in addressing a number of structural weaknesses and in keeping inflation low.
- Received foreign direct investment of \$1.5 billion in 2013, up from \$1.3 billion in 2012 as investor confidence has been boosted by infrastructure development and tax incentives.
- · Prudent economic management during global financial crisis led the International Monetary Fund to elevate Sri Lanka to Middle Income Country status in 2010.
- Economic projections call for Sri Lanka to have a per capita income of \$4,000 by 2016, a 67 percent increase from the current \$3,280, highlighting a strong middle-income economy.

#### **Tourism**

The tourism sector has rebounded too. While Sri Lanka welcomed only 500,000 tourists in 2009, 1.27 million foreigners visited the country in 2013 and this figure is expected to increase to 2.5 million arrivals in 2016. Foreign companies are expecting growth opportunities in tourism, with Starwood Hotels & Resorts slated to open a 306-room hotel in 2015. Five Chinese cities have direct flights to Sri Lanka to accommodate the expected 120,000 Chinese tourists this year.



#### Political and Social Progress in the North

The government initiated "Uthuru Vasanthaya," the Northern Spring, aimed at expediting development in the North by making the Northern Economy partners in the country's progress. Due to the government's efforts, economic growth in the northern region now stands at 23.8 percent. The government also made an important commitment and has since resettled most of the nearly 300,000 internally displaced Tamil civilians in the North under an economic growth and stability partnership.



For 40 years, the Tamil Tigers prevented holding any elections in the northern region. After the war, the government undertook measures to restore the right of franchise to the people and successfully held two elections — local and provincial. The Northern Province now has stable governing bodies led by the Tamil National Alliance.

In 2010, the government created an independent Lessons Learnt and Reconciliation Commission (LLRC) to investigate what led to the failure of the ceasefire agreements, ascertain facts and circumstances around the war and determine a process to seek reconciliation among communities. After an 18-month inquiry, the LLRC submitted its report to the parliament in 2011. The President also appointed special task force to work out the Committee's recommendations, many of which are being implemented. The work plan has already been made public to ensure transparency.








1. Successive Sri Lankan governments have attempted to engage the Tamil Tigers in negotiations to achieve a peaceful solution to the conflict. Despite its rhetoric to the outside world that it claimed to care deeply about ordinary citizens, the Tamil Tigers never seriously addressed the issues confronting the ordinary Tamil. Nevertheless, the Government of Sri Lanka put forward proposals and took action to address many of these concerns. The Tamil Tigers only took positions and actions during the peace talks that advanced its own agenda: its quest for absolute and unequivocal power over all Tamils in the country, achieving status of being the sole representative for the Tamil people, and domination of the North and East of the country.

The history of efforts to talk peace and the reasons for successive failures demonstrates that for the Tamil Tigers, a negotiated peaceful solution was never a viable option:


2. On 01 October 1987, during a cease-fire, the Tamil Tigers launched a <u>pogrom against Sinhalese</u> <u>civilians</u> in the East, killing 211 civilians within two weeks and wounding 39. These attacks were as follows:


3. During this period, the Tamil Tigers' open hostility and their refusal to surrender arms led to the Indian Peace Keeping Force (IPKF) becoming an active participant in the conflict. The IPKF directly fought the Tamil Tigers for the following two years, during which the Tamil Tigers killed 1,138 Indian soldiers and wounded 2,762 according to IPKF records. The sustained violations of the Ceasefire Agreement by the Tamil Tigers had made it abundantly clear that they used the ceasefire only as cover for achieving its military objectives.

4. Despite the Tamil Tigers' many attempts to provoke a military response from the Government of Sri Lanka, the government did not respond until military intervention became the last resort, preventing a series of burgeoning humanitarian crises caused by the Tamil Tigers, beginning with the closure of the Mavil Aru sluice gates in July 2006, and such incursions in Trincomalee South in the East, in Muhamallai and Kayts in the Jaffna peninsula. The Government of Sri Lanka, forced to react to the brazen provocations of the Tamil Tigers, was impelled to counter this unceasing threat by launching a proactive Humanitarian Operation on 24 August 2006.









#### **Statement from Russian Ministry of Sport**

#### May 20, 2016

The Russian Ministry of Sport fully supports the IOC's actions to protect clean athletes. We agree with the decision that athletes who are doping, no matter what country they represent, should be punished and not be permitted to compete at competitions.

However, we strongly believe that clean athletes, who have spent years of their lives training, should not be deprived of the right to participate. We are willing to extend all cooperation to WADA in their investigation and have officially informed WADA of this.

We have acknowledged we've had doping problems and that changes are needed. We have taken concrete steps to prove our commitment to clean and fair sport and have agreed with WADA to a planning "road map" to reform the anti-doping process:

- All samples are collected by foreign companies and planning of those tests are carried out by UKAD, Britain's anti-doping agency. All samples are analyzed in labs accredited by WADA.
- Two full-time international WADA experts are now working in RUSADA and we have invited WADA to recommend a foreign expert to head the Russian laboratory. WADA has already suggested two candidates.
- Russia is financing an additional testing program for the Russian track and field athletes who may be competing in Rio. Each such athlete will now be tested a minimum of three times by the IAAF, in addition to all the anti-doping tests they may have in the normal course of their preparation.

We recognize that we have to regain international community's trust for what we believe is a global issue and are working hard toward that.

# ENNAHDHA'S EVOLUTION TO MEET TUNISIA'S NEEDS Creating a More Prosperous and Inclusive Tunisia

At its tenth national Party Congress, Ennahdha, Tunisia's party of Muslim democrats, announced a major evolution which will help establish a more prosperous and inclusive Tunisia. Ennahdha's members voted to focus on political and policy activities which deliver the tangible outcomes of democracy, rather than a combination of political, social and religious initiatives. The separation of politics and religion will see Ennahdha become a civil party, much like Germany's Christian Democratic Party, and will allow Ennahdha to concentrate on the next phase of the country's democratic transition since the 2011 revolution, strengthening the economy.

#### **Separating Politics from Religion**

- Ennahdha will be a national democratic party devoted to reform and development. This
  evolution formalises a long-term trend within the party to prioritise policies and
  initiatives which reflect Tunisians' needs.
- Ennahdha will still draw its values from Islam, which is fully compatible with democracy and human rights, and Tunisia's 2014 Constitution.
- With the decision, Ennahdha will no longer ascribe to 'political Islam', as freedom of religion is now protected by Tunisia's Constitution. Therefore the struggle against repression on the basis of religious beliefs is no longer a factor in Tunisia.
- To carry out this historic change, party leaders can no longersimultaneously holdleadership positions in civil society organizations, including religious associations. They are also now prohibited from preaching in mosques, even informally or occasionally.

#### **Defining and Confirming Ennahdha's New Direction**

- Ennahdha's policy activities now focus on delivering the tangible results of democracy: improved security from terrorism, job creation, economic growth, improved healthcare and infrastructure, and reforms to stop corruption and inefficient bureaucracy.
- Ennahdha engaged in an intensive grassroots consultation process with its members to determine the path forward, bringing together thousands of members at local and regional party conferences in Tunisia and around the world.
- Party Congress delegates were united in their approval of Ennahdha's new direction, with 80.8 percent supporting the new relationship between political and social work.
- During the Party Congress, Ennahdha members approved motions to address the various challenges facing Tunisia related to the economy, security and the need for reform.
- Support was overwhelming: 93.5 percent approved Ennahdha's political priorities; 89.3
  percent approved its economic priorities; and 87.5 percent approved its security
  priorities.
- Ennahdha also opened itself up to broader membership by relaxing joining conditions and procedures and facilitating professionals' and youth access to the party's decisionmaking committees.

#### Reaffirming Ennahdha's Leadership

- Ennahdha re-elected Cheikh Rached Ghannouchi as President, with support from approximately 75 percent of party delegates.
- In remarks at the Party Congress, Cheikh Rached Ghannouchi, the founder and President of Ennahdha, stated, "the success of this conference is primarily about presenting a renewed, united Ennahdha that is able to participate in solving Tunisia's problems, a party of national ambition, a party of objective analysis and constructive criticism that give rise to a democratic alternative, a party that is open to its environment and to all capabilities and potential, a party that is proud of its members men and women."

#### **Ennahdha Statement on Gasserine Protests**

Following the social protests that began in Gasserine following the death of Ridha Yahyaoui, may God have merey on him, who died protesting against deprivation from work, and following the continuation and expansion of protests and escalation of tensions, Ennahdha Party:

- Prays for the soul of the young Ridha Yahyaoui and presents its sincere condolences to his family.
- Appreciates the legitimate demands for employment and combating poverty and marginalisation
  which are at the core of the demands of the Revolution of Freedom and Dignity, and calls for
  preserving the peaceful nature of protests and avoiding all forms of violence and attacks on
  public and private property.
- Calls for calm, particularly after the success of social negotiations in the private sector, and calls

  efforts on employment and balanced development, and calls on it to launch urgent programmes
  to that end.
- Warns against the danger of instrumentalizing the legitimate demands of deprived groups and regions and exploiting them to serve partisan agendas.

#### Ennahdha Statement on Recent Developments in Saudi-Iranian Relations

Following recent developments in Saudi-Iranian relations and the escalation which led to the severing of diplomatic relations between the two countries, Ennahdha Party:

- Strongly condemns the attack on Saudi diplomatic missions and calls for respecting international accords, which require the protection of diplomatic and consular missions.
- Stresses the need to remain committed to the principle of non-interference in internal affairs in order to maintain good relations between neighbouring states.
- Calls for a peaceful resolution between these two Muslim countries, and warns against being dragged into further escalation and its dangers for the entire region.

#### **Chairman Royce Applauds Tunisia's Continued Democratic Transition**

House Foreign Affairs Committee Chairman Ed Royce (R-CA) released the following statement marking the five year anniversary of the popular uprising in Tunisia that ousted former President Zine el-Abedin Ben Ali, paving the way for the emergence of the region's first democratically elected government:

"The self-immolation of a Tunisian street vendor sparked protests across the region. Five years later, Tunisia has stood out as a model for peaceful democratic development – successfully completing free and fair elections for parliament and the presidency, instituting market-based economic reforms, and advancing civil liberties. Tunisia stands out in a region beset by repression, chaos and economic stagnation. Tunisia must continue on its democratic path, addressing the underlying social and economic issues that gave rise to the so-called Arab Spring but the government's resilience in the face of regional terrorism and is encouraging and should be supported."

#### **Ennahdha Prepares for Local Conferences**

In preparation of the national conference, 277 branches of the Ennahdha Party have so far held local conferences between January 3-17 to elect delegates for its regional conferences in preparation for the national conference due to be held in Spring 2016. The local parties also debated during these meetings the five papers forming the roadmap of the tenth National Conference (Evaluation, Strategy, Reference and Value Framework, Political Program, Internal Structure).

Although the article is very critical of the political, economic and humanitarian situation in the wider region, Tunisia is clearly positioned as the success story of the Arab Spring: "On January 14th those protesters forced Zein al Abidine Ben Ali, Tunisia's dictator for the previous quarter-century, from office. What followed was not easy. Terrorism hindered both economic progress and deeper political reform. But in 2015 the country became the first Arab state ever to be judged fully 'free' by Freedom House, an American monitor of civil liberties, and it moved up a record 32 places among countries vetted by the Vienna-based Democracy Ranking Association. [...] Sadly, that outcome remains a stark anomaly."

#### Mr. Ghannouchi says Tunisia Better off Five Years after Revolution

In the first of a two-part interview, leader of Ennahdha Party Rashid Ghannouchi spoke to Anadolu Agency about where Tunisia stands five years after the revolution. Mr. Ghannouchi discussed Tunisia's success in consolidating democratic institutions: "Tunisia advanced on the path of democracy, wrote a new constitution and created constitutional institutions like the Constitutional Court, a commission for transitional justice, a justice council, electoral bodies and agencies to monitor the media, which are all independent." He also noted that Ennahdha is "a partner in power and we insist on this partnership. Talk about clashes between Nidaa and Ennahdha is not true. No rivalry took place between our sympathizers. There are disputes inside Nidaa and not between Nidaa and Ennahdha."

#### The Guardian: The Arab Spring: Why did Things go so Badly Wrong?

The Guardian published an opinion piece on the anniversary of the Arab Spring, which stated: "What factors made it possible for Tunisia to make a transition to a multiparty democracy? Two which have often been cited are the Tunisian army's traditional apolitical ethos and Tunisia's cultural affinity to Europe. But a third key factor, closely related to these two, was the remarkable role of the Ennahdha party. Long before 2011, this Islamist body – very different from Islamist groups in other countries – had been developing in a strongly democratic direction. Under Ben Ali's presidency, its experience of extreme repression led it to act in concert with other political parties. After the revolution it recognised explicitly the absolutely fundamental precondition of democracy – that parties must be willing to lose an election. In 2014 Ennahdha was as good as its word, losing an election and immediately conceding."



#### Profile of the Week: Ahmed Mechergui



Ahmed Mechergui is a Tunisian politician, a member of the Assembly of the People's Representatives and a member of Ennahdha External Relations committee. Born on August 4, 1969, he completed primary and high school in Jendouba and passed his Baccalaureate in 1991. He then studied Philosophy at the Faculty of Human Sciences of Raggueda (Kairouan), where he received his degree in 1995.

He then began teaching philosophy in Tunisian private secondary establishments. In 2003 he left Tunisia for France, where he stayed until the Revolution of Freedom and Dignity and the ousting of former dictator Ben Ali.

He obtained a Masters in 2005 and a PhD in Philosophy. He has published a number of works, including his book "The Reality of Globalization" published in 2003 and many articles in national and international outlets.

In 2011 he was elected as a member of the National Constituent Assembly in the constituency of Jendouba, for which he was head of the Ennahdha list. During his mandate, he was Vice-President of the Commission of Services Sectors and a member of the Committee of the Preamble, the Fundamental Principles and Revision of the Constitution.

In 2014, his constituency gave him its trust again, electing him a member of the Assembly of the People's Representatives. He is currently a member of the Committee for Organisation of the Administration and Affairs of the Army Forces. He also represents the Tunisian Parliament in the Arab Parliament.

#### A word from Rached Ghannouchi, President, Ennahdha Party



#### Rached Ghannouchi on progress in Tunisia:

Five years after the revolution, Tunisians are now more politically free than ever before. However, our country faces considerable economic and security challenges with domestic and international extremist networks seeking to derail our democratic progress.

2016 is a hugely important year for Tunisia. The Tunisian Government is undertaking a number of significant reforms to address the challenges facing the country. As part of the Unity Government, Ennahdha are proud to be contributing to these critical reforms. Last month, the government made progress on its restructuring of the financial sector and injected \$440 million

into state-owned banks ("Société Tunisienne de Banque" and "Banque de l'Habitat").

The government is also working on a new banking law to make our central bank independent, developing reforms to support entrepreneurs and promote private sector growth. Most importantly, our ambitious five-year development plan 2016-2020 outlines a number of reforms and projects targeted at achieving a 5% growth in the next five years, and working closely with international partners to obtain the necessary technical assistance.

If these reforms can provide Tunisia with the required economic growth, Tunisia can be a powerful antidote to extremism across the region, as a model for how a moderate, inclusive society can thrive in the Arab world. Moderate Muslim democratic parties are essential to help build stability and prosperity across the Middle East and North Africa. Tunisia's model of political inclusion based on coexistence between moderates of all tendencies, whether religious or secularist, provides a desperately needed alternative to the extremism of ISIS, Al Qaeda and other groups.

2016 will be a huge test for Tunisia and the region as a whole. To achieve our five-year objectives, we must continue significant social and economic reforms in our country. The support of the international community is critical to help sustain our democratic progress, grow the economy and promote peaceful development in order to provide a successful counter-narrative to extremism. We look forward to 2016 as the year for reforms that will drive Tunisia closer to achieving the core demands of the Revolution of Freedom and Dignity and meet the aspirations of its people.

#### **Ennahdha Updates**

#### **Statement by Governing Coalition Parties' Coordination Committee**

On January 23, 2016, the Governing Coalition Parties' Coordination Committee held an extraordinary meeting at the headquarters of Nidaa Tounes Party to discuss recent events in the country, namely the peaceful protests based on noble and legitimate demands that were exploited by criminal groups to target state institutions and public and private properties, and politically instrumentalized by some for known ends. At this sensitive time, the governing coalition parties would like to express their:

- 1. Emphasis on the legitimate nature of the demands of deprived regions and broad sections of youth for work, dignified life and an end to injustice and discrimination.
- 2. Commitment and pledge to work with the government and the Assembly of the People's Representatives to eradicate corruption, lift administrative restrictions and revise the laws that obstruct internal and external investment which have the potential to create jobs, incorporate youth and give them hope.
- Support and solidarity with the government and its call on it to consider the necessary
  amendments and reprioritization through adopting urgent measures with direct effect on job
  creation, accelerating the pace of reforms and implementing major projects in the deprived
  regions.
- 4. Prayers for the souls of the martyrs, officer Sofien Bousellimi and youth Ridha Yahyaoui, and their condemnation of acts of vandalism, looting and attempts at taking over legitimate protests and exploiting them to threaten state institutions, social peace and the gains of the democratic transition.
- 5. Appreciation of the discipline and professionalism of the security and military institutions and of their patriotism in dealing with recent events by applying the law and protecting liberties.

The Coordination Committee also discussed the mechanisms for activating its role in this phase so as to assume its full responsibility before the people and the country, and recommended the immediate holding of its experts' committee in order to support the government to adopt a set of suitable urgent measures.

The Coordination Committee called on the President of the Republic and the Prime Minister to organize a National Conference on Employment as soon as possible, without excluding anyone, as an embodiment of the principle of consensus-building, with the aim of overcoming contingent and structural difficulties and finding suitable solutions that are acceptable to all to consolidate social peace and national unity. The Coordination Committee's meeting remains in session in order to communicate with various state institutions.

He also emphasized that support from the international community in this process is essential.

Having set a growth target of 2.5 percent in 2016 and following its successful democratic transition, Tunisia's coalition government has been working hard to reform its economy.

#### Bloomberg Business Interview with Zied Ladhari: Angry Tunisians are Short of Money and Jobs

In an interview with Bloomberg, Ennahdha's Minister of Employment and Vocational Training Zied Ladhari stated that after the revolution, Tunisia has made remarkable progress in terms of the political process, but that on the economic and social front the country is still facing major challenges as well as high expectations from its people. Therefore, the Tunisian government is currently planning and preparing several measures to revive its economy, including holding a donor conference to stimulate economic aid, preparing a five-year economic plan it hopes to present to Parliament in March and organizing an international conference later in the year where Tunisia will seek to secure aid, loans with concessions and public and private partnerships.

#### Ennahdha Prepares for Local and Municipal Elections to be held on October 30, 2016

On January 23, Ennahdha Local Governance and Elections Committee and Legal Affairs Committee organized a joint workshop on the draft Local Governance Code and the draft Election Law. The discussion addressed the details of the two draft laws, including the legislative process for the election law, the need for new administrative divisions before the municipal elections (proposal of the compatibility of the delegation (المعتمدية) and the municipality so as to not deprive any citizen of the right to vote), the right of members of the military



and police forces to vote during the upcoming elections, the candidacy age threshold (18, 20 or 32), the question of full-time work for the Mayor and members of the Municipal bureau, the question of introducing horizontal parity conditions, and the electoral system (party-list proportional representation based on the D'Hondt system).

In response to recent protests, Tunisia's Prime Minister Habib Essid reiterated that Tunisia's democracy would be preserved "whatever the cost." There has been huge political progress but we acknowledge that there are lots of economic difficulties. We will respond to young people's economic demands but we need a bit of time for that."



#### Profile of the Week: Kalthoum Badreddine



Born on July 2, 1963, Kalthoum Badreddine is a politician, lawyer, member of Ennahdha Party's Consultative Council and member of the House of the People's Representatives.

#### Rached Ghannouchi on progress in Tunisia:

Tunisia is heralded as the success story of the Arab Spring, having been the only Arab country to transition from an oppressive regime to an open, democratic society. ## **Ennahdha Updates**

#### **Ennahdha Party Consultative Council Statement**

The Consultative Council of Ennahdha Party held its 41st session on February 13-14, 2016, during which it discussed national, regional and international developments. The Council also discussed preparation for the Party's tenth national conference. Following discussions, the Council:

- Commended the efforts made by the logistical preparation committee on their successful organization of 279 local conferences.
- Approved all the content to be presented to the Party's regional conferences before being put to the National Conference. The Council also decided to start holding regional and sectorial conferences at the end of this month.
- Stressed that overcoming the many problems facing our country, particularly in regards to Libya, requires the support of national unity between all political and social actors and rising above political wrangling regarding marginal issues and contrived disputes.
- Emphasized the country's need for consensus between political actors and social organizations to resolve the principle challenge of unemployment.
- Stressed the legitimacy of the demands of protesters and their right to peaceful protest.
- Called on the government to monitor the implementation of the urgent measures it had adopted, to implement a developmental plan.
- Commended the role of the Assembly of the People's Representatives and called on it to finalize
  plans for stimulating economic development in the country through the adoption of the new
  investment code, and create suitable economic conditions that can help reduce social tension.
- Called on the private sector to assume their role in this sensitive phase, through further recruitment and launching projects particularly in inner regions and supporting the government's efforts in resolving the problem of unemployment.

#### In relation to the Libyan situation, the Council stressed:

- The Party's support for the official Tunisian position of opposing military intervention in Libya.
- The Party's continuation of all possible efforts towards facilitating the formation of a Libyan Government of National Unity that can start to coordinate a response to the various economic, social and security threats facing the country.

#### In the News

#### Rached Ghannouchi: Islam, Democracy and the Future of the Muslim World

The Huffington Post published a speech by Ennahdha President Rached Ghannouchi on democratic progress in the Arab world delivered on October 1, 2014 at Columbia University's Institute for Religion, Culture and Public Life. In his address, Mr. Ghannouchi set out the reasons behind Tunisia's democratic successes so far, including Ennahdha's commitment to consensus politics and its rejection of monopoly of power.

#### The Hill Op-Ed: Tunisia and Ukraine - Linchpins of U.S. Interests

An op-ed in *The Hill* by Kristin M. Lord and William B. Taylor argue that Tunisia and Ukraine offer crucial opportunities for America and its allies to advance their strategic interests and potentially transform today's dangerous security environment. It said, "A failed Tunisia would not only be a tragedy for Tunisians who led the Arab Spring and united to transform their society peacefully. It would be an unparalleled victory for ISIS and other extremist movements — already recruiting heavily in Tunisia — as well as a blow to all those within the region who wish to establish just, representative governments." Overall, the article stresses the need for a U.S. foreign policy that prioritizes Tunisia and Ukraine.

#### U.S. Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs Travels to Africa and the Maghreb

A press release from the State Department announced that Under Secretary of State for Political Affairs Thomas Shannon will travel to Morocco, Tunisia, Algeria, Burkina Faso and Mali on February 16-25: "On February 18-19, Ambassador Shannon will travel to Tunis to affirm with government officials the growing strategic partnership between our countries, meet with civil society leaders to discuss their important role in ensuing citizen engagement in political processes and meet with staff in our Libya External Office."

#### Tech Crunch: Tunisia is Becoming MENA's Next Start-up Hub

Tech Crunch reported that since the 2011 Arab Revolution, the Tunisian start-up scene has blossomed due to faster and freer Internet access and technological advances. Reportedly, the most successful Tunisian start-ups focus on mobilizing communities and encouraging civic engagement with which they stimulate the Tunisian economy and provide essential support to the government. The article said Tunisian start-ups are finding ways to improve their society and fix endemic economic problems through innovation and creativity. It concludes that moving into 2016, Tunisia will be an important country to watch in the MENA's start-up scene.

#### Carnegie: Tunisia cited as best Arab country in terms of governance

Carnegie Endowment of International Peace's Middle East Program conducted the first survey of Arab experts that represents the detailed views of 105 experts from almost every Arab country on the array of challenges facing the Middle East. Three themes in particular stand out from the survey: government legitimacy, prioritization of local concerns and democratic prospects. Experts were asked to name the three Arab countries that best provide governance for their peoples. Nearly two in three cite Tunisia, which for all of its continuing challenges has emerged five years after its revolution as the most politically inclusive society in the Arab world.

#### European Council on Foreign Relations: A New European Agenda for North Africa

A publication in the European Council on Foreign Relations edited by Anthony Dworkin argues that five years after the Arab uprisings, the EU needs to keep its ambitions to promote reform in the region. There are chapters for Tunisia, Morocco, Algeria, Egypt and Libya. Monica Marks' Tunisia chapter argues that Tunisia's international partners should make clear that security is inseparable from good governance, and focus on mapping the key bureaucratic obstacles to reform. She recommends supporting measures to reform the structures of the Tunisian state to improve its ability to meet popular aspirations and combat security threats.

#### Reuters: Tunisia to get \$560 mln Loan from EU to Boost Economy

As part of broader efforts by the EU to help Tunisia overcome its socio-economic issues, *Reuters* reported that the country is to get a loan of half a billion euros (\$560 million) from the European Union. The EU said the assistance came at the request of Tunisia and will take the form of medium-term loans on favorable financial terms.

#### Reuters: IMF to Start Talks with Tunisia Over New Loan Program - Official

In addition to the EU loan, the Ennahdha Party welcomes the news that the International Monetary Fund is planning a visit to Tunisia to begin talks on a new credit program. According to a Tunisian official, the program is likely to be worth at least \$1.7 billion and will help Tunisia revive its economy.

#### Tunisia: World Bank to Provide 500 mln Dinars to Improve Transportation

The World Bank has announced that it will support Tunisia's transport sector reforms with 500 million Tunisian dinars.

#### The Economist: Democracy Index 2015 - Democracy in an Age of Anxiety

The Economist Intelligence Unit's Democracy Index provides a snapshot of the state of democracy worldwide for 165 independent states and two territories. Although the MENA region has experienced an overall decline in its score in the Index, Tunisia moved from being a "hybrid regime" to a "flawed democracy" in 2014 and has continued to build the foundations of democracy, with its October 2014 parliamentary election attracting a higher voter turnout than in past elections, ushering in a new secular Islamist coalition government in February 2015. Despite the negative momentum in much of the region, the average regional score is higher than it was prior to the onset of the Arab Spring.

#### Freedom House: The Map that Shows Most and Least Free Countries in the World

Last week, democracy watchdog organization Freedom House released its annual list of free countries in the world, drawing the conclusion that "global freedom is under pressure." Tunisia is the only country in the MENA region that was classified as a "free" country.

#### Human Rights Watch: Tunisia - Landmark Step for Detainee Rights

In a revision of the Code of Criminal Procedure on February 2, the Tunisian Parliament approved changes in detainee rights by granting suspects the right to a lawyer from the onset of detention and by shortening the maximum pre-charge detention. According to Human Rights Watch, this is a "significant breakthrough for human rights" in Tunisia.

## **Tunisian Ambassador Chairs UN Women Executive Board Session**

On February 9, the UN Women Executive Board organized its first Regular Session at the United Nations Headquarters in New York. The Chair of the session, Ambassador Mohamed Khaled Khiari from the Permanent Mission of Tunisia, introduced the session and UN Women Executive Director Phumzile Mlambo-Ngcuka gave an opening statement. Taking a closer look at UN Women's work on the ground, the Board discussed the organization's operational response in Egypt, the joint field visit of the Executive Boards of UNDP/UNFPA/UNOPS, UNICEF, UN Women and the WFP to Jordan in 2015 and UN Women's operations in the Za'atari refugee camp in Jordan, as well as several other initiatives relating to gender equality. Ennahdha Party parliamentarians Sana Mersni, Sayida Ounissi and Imen Ben Mohamed attended the summit to work on the creation of an Arab Women MPs Network for Gender Equality.

## Profile of the Week: Badreddine Abdelkafi



Badreddine Abdelkafi is a Member of the Tunisian Parliament representing the Sfax 2 constituency. He serves on the parliamentary Committee on Industry, Energy, Natural Resources, Infrastructure and the Environment as well as on the Elections Committee. Mr. Abdelkafi also has the honor of having served in the National Constituent Assembly as Assistant to the President of the Assembly charged with relations with citizens and with civil society.

Mr. Abdelkafi was born on July 7, 1959 in Sfax, and earned his university degree in physics and mathematics from the Sfax campus of the University of Sciences in 1981, after which he taught mathematics at high school level for 7 years in the city of Gabes in southern Tunisia. In April 1981, Mr. Abdelkafi represented a group of students from the Tunisian south in the National

Summit meeting of the Islamic Movement, during which a new political party - the Islamic Tendency Movement - was announced. In the aftermath of that meeting, he was arrested by the police for questioning and released, and then again arrested in 1987 and held without charge in prison for 8 months. In 1991, Mr. Abdelkafi was formally charged with founding an illegal organization and sentenced to 11 years in prison, which he served, finally being released in 2002.

After the January 14, 2011 revolution, he was elected as General Secretary of the regional office of Ennahdha in the southern Sfax region, the same region that he was elected to represent in the National Constituent Assembly in Tunisia's first free and fair election on October 23 of that year.

As member of the National Constituent Assembly in charge of Relations with Civil Society, he took the initiative to form a team representing all political tendencies in the Assembly, and worked closely with all blocs to build a vision of how the Assembly should involve civil society in its work, in a very extraordinary post-revolution moment in which the foundations of a new governing system were being built. His team organized a National Dialogue around the Constitution with public meetings in all the regions of the country.

Mr. Abdelkafi said his approach of working with civil society is based on "the core value of openness to all representatives of civil society, trying to accompany them in their activities, to open doors to them, listen to them and benefit from them and to give them the possibility to participate in this foundational phase... If there is a shared belief and concern by the Assembly and civil society in the importance of the inclusion of the citizen in decision-making, we can do it."

Mr. Abdelkafi is a proud husband and father of three children, and has done incredible work in his various capacities of bringing people together towards a common goal, most notably on working closely with civil society organizations to build broad consensus on the constitution passed on 27 January 2014.

## A word from Rached Ghannouchi, President and Co-Founder, Ennahdha Party



Rached Ghannouchi on progress in Tunisia:

The recent social unrest in Kasserine reinforces the fundamental challenge facing Tunisia - a well-educated, ambitious and young section of society feels unable to realize their potential. However, comparisons between the recent events in Kasserine and events in Sidi Bouzid five years ago are both inaccurate and unhelpful.

Tunisia deserves to be recognized as the shining light of the Arab Spring. Our democratic transition follows years of political and economic stagnation, and like every democratic project, it takes time to be fully realized. Given regional instability and a global financial slowdown, the fact that Tunisia has maintained

stable governance while holding two free and fair elections, whilst drafting and implementing a new progressive constitution, is a remarkable achievement.

This point was eloquently made by Brian Klaas, who recently argued that a country cannot become democratic overnight - assessing Tunisia five years after the Arab Spring would be akin to assessing Japan in 1950. Although we must ensure we make more progress on the socio-economic situation in the country, we must also be realistic that Tunisia's democratic transition is a long-term project, where the occasional setback is to be expected.

However, there is much to be optimistic about, such as the recent news that Tunisia is fast becoming the region's next tech start-up hub. Since the revolution in 2011, thousands of new tech start-ups have benefited from faster, freer internet access and advances in technology, finding ways to actively improve their society and help solve economic problems through innovation and creativity.

Such innovation goes hand in hand with improved economic and political governance - in which Tunisia is also making huge progress. The recent Carnegie Endowment survey that asked regional experts to name the best Arab countries that best provide governance for their peoples showed Tunisia as the clear number one example of good governance in the region. This good governance model will be further strengthened through the many important constitutional institutions to be founded this year, including the Constitutional Court and independent constitutional commissions on human rights, good governance and anti-corruption, sustainable development, and media and communication.

Ennahdha continues to work hard to realize the aspirations of the country's youth, and the ambitious levels of economic growth forecast for the country reflect this, with 5% GDP growth predicted by 2020. With municipal elections coming later this year, and many critical reforms to come this year, the need for political consensus will be crucial in combating the social, economic and security threats facing the country. Ennahdha will continue to work alongside our coalition partners, Nidaa Tounes, UPL and Afek, for the good of the country. Step by step, Tunisia is consolidating its place as the shining light of the Arab Spring.

## A Word from Rached Ghannouchi, President and Co-Founder, Ennahdha Party



#### Rached Ghannouchi on progress in Tunisia:

At our tenth national Party Congress in May, Ennahdha announced a major evolution to help establish a more prosperous and inclusive Tunisia. Our members voted for the separation of the political and religious fields, and to confirm Ennahdha's focus as a civil party, much like Germany's Christian Democratic Party. Since the conclusion of our congress we have started implementing many of the changes agreed to the party structure, changes that will improve the workings of the party and ensure the stability of Tunisia's political system.

Another area Ennahdha are keen to improve is the involvement of women in our political system. Indeed the Tunisian Parliament, with the support of Ennahdha MPs, recently passed a bill for gender parity in all local electoral lists, that will greatly

All parties and electoral lists must now put forward equal numbers of male and female candidates, and ensure an equal gender representation at the head of their lists. The upcoming local elections mark an important step in Tunisia's democratic consolidation. They will bring to the fore thousands of new elected representatives, chosen to address the local needs and priorities of their districts and constituents, and establish more inclusive, responsive and open governance that is closer to each citizen.

Tunisia has also been making strides in ensuring the security of tourist sites across the country. The tourism industry has suffered as a result of last year's tragic attacks, yet tourists are starting to come back. Security cooperation and training programs with many of our allies have helped improve the capabilities of our security services and establish a number of specialist security centers and new training programs. Tunisia is committed to ensure that our country and our resorts are safe, while continuing to give Tunisians the confidence to continue forward on their democratic path.

Tunis, June 13, 2016

The city of Orlando, Florida, in the United States witnessed a terrorist attack in a night club resulting in over a hundred victims killed and injured. Following this horrific crime in one of the worst mass shootings in US history, Ennahdha Party:

- Strongly condemns this terrorist attack and presents its condolences to the victims' families and to the American people.
- Stresses that the attack contravenes the values of Islam and violates its teachings and that the
  perpetrator does not represent Muslims.
- Calls for desisting from exploiting this terrorist attack to sow hatred and division between communities and faiths, and stresses that terrorism is a global threat that requires a global strategy to counter it.

#### Rached Ghannouchi Q&A: Thoughts on Democratic Islam - Middle East Eye - June 12, 2016

In an interesting interview with Middle East Eye, Cheikh Rached Ghannouchi comments on Ennahdha's move away from political Islam and the Party's separation of politics and religion. Asked if he thinks Ennahdha could become a national party at the core of political life in Tunisia, he stated, "Tunisians are homogenous, very unified, while there is real plurality in thought and culture. There is a large center ground. Ennahdha can represent this center of ordinary Tunisians within the middle and lower class."

#### Rached Ghannouchi Leads Ennahdha Delegation to Paris - Middle East Monitor - June 23, 2016

An Ennahdha delegation paid an official visit to Paris last week, led by the Party's President, Cheikh Rached Ghannouchi. The delegation held meetings with a number of government, political and intellectual figures, including Jean Marc Ayrault, French Minister of Foreign Affairs, Elisabeth Guigou, President of the Commission on Foreign Affairs in the National Assembly, Claude Bartolone, Speaker of the Assembly, Jean Pierre Raffarin, President of the Senate Foreign Affairs Committee and former PM, an IPEMED delegation and Jack Lang, President of the "Institut du Monde Arabe" and former Education and Culture Minister.

#### Tunisian Parliament Passes Gender Parity Bill for Local Elections - Middle East Eye - June 16, 2016

Tunisia's parliament passed a bill last week that will greatly help the country to increase female representation at next year's March 2017 local elections, with parties or blocks having to put forward an equal number of male and female list leaders. Yusra Ghannouchi, spokesperson for the Ennahdha party, said the bill is "a further step towards increasing women's participation in decision making and management of local authorities, and a recognition of all the women who are very active in their local areas."

#### <u>Tunisian Assembly to Examine Bill to Criminalize Racial Discrimination</u> – Tunisia Live – June 15, 2016

Tunisia's Parliament is set to consider a bill which criminalises discrimination presented by the civil society organizations Euromed Rights, the Tunisian Forum for Social and Economic Rights and the Committee for the Respect of Human Rights and Liberties in Tunisia. Commenting on the bill and its application to all minorities, Ramy Khouili, Maghreb Policy Adviser at EuroMed Rights, stated, "The fact that racial discrimination will finally be criminalized in Tunisian law is a huge step in the battle for full equality of all Tunisian citizens. We hope to continue making progress going forward."

#### Tunisia Named Top Arab Country on the "Good Country Index" - Al Bawaba - June 9, 2016

Tunisia is ranked first among all Arab countries and 48<sup>th</sup> worldwide on the Good Country Index, which measures what each country contributes to the common good of humanity, and what it takes away, relative to its size. The league table is based on 35 separate indicators from sources including the United Nations and the World Bank. Egypt held the second position on the Arab level, followed by Qatar, Jordan, Lebanon then Morocco, Oman, Saudi Arabia, Kuwait and Bahrain.

European Union Approves 500 Million Euro Loan to Tunisia - Reuters Africa - June 9, 2016

The EU has approved a 500 million euro loan to help Tunisia address economic challenges and strengthen its democracy. "A plan to lend Tunisia 500 million euros on favorable terms to help it reduce its external debt and consolidate its democratic mechanisms was backed by MEPs on Wednesday," the European Parliament said.

Foreign Firms Seek to Invest in 35 Solar, Wind Projects in Tunisia – SeeNews Renewables – June 27, 2016

Thirty-five companies from France, Belgium and Spain have expressed interest in investing in solar and wind projects in Tunisia. The potential investments could include 20 photovoltaic (PV) power schemes and 15 wind projects. The Tunisian cabinet is expected to approve the investments at a cabinet meeting in two weeks.

#### Tunisia Commemorates Victims of Beach Massacre - AFP - June 26, 2016

Tunisians held a memorial service to mark the one-year anniversary of the terrorist attacks in Sousse. Tunisia's Tourism Minister Selma Elloumi Rekik and British Foreign Office official Tobias Ellwood laid flowers to remember the victims of the shooting in the town of Port El Kantaoui south of the capital.

<u>Tunisia: Our Voices Will not be Silenced – Women's Struggle for Justice in Tunisia</u> – All Africa – June 21, 2016 The International Center for Transitional Justice reports on its project in Tunisia to encourage women to come forward to file submissions to the Truth and Dignity Commission regarding violations of their rights under the former regime. The "Transitional Justice is also for Women" network has worked to raise awareness and ensure that women's testimonies are heard relating to abuses suffered by Tunisian women at the hands of the regime from 1955 onwards, including torture, imprisonment, victimization and sexual violence.

<u>UK Considers Easing Travel Warning Imposed after Tunisia Attack</u> – The Guardian – June 29, 2016

The UK is expected to lift its advisory not to travel to Tunisia—a welcome change for the Tunisian tourism sector, the Guardian reports. The UK would likely lift the advisory in phases, starting after the end of Ramadan.

# Turkey a resilient nation despite attempted coup

It has been one year since the bloody and, thankfully, failed coup attempt by FETO in Turkey. I was with family in Ankara, the capital, for summer leave on the night of July 15. I will remember forever how I was almost speechless trying to explain to my little daughter why on Earth fighter jets were flying so frighteningly close and loud as well as the horrific sound of distant bombing of state institutions, including the Parliament.

Obviously, the trauma was much worse at the national level. They killed 250 people and wounded more than 2,000. They also wanted to assassinate President Erdogan. In essence, they aimed at the very heart of our constitutional order. But the Türkish people stood up against this calamity and heroic averted what may have been the greatest blow to our democracy.

So, who are the members of FETO? What do they want? The followers of Fethullah Gulen, the head of FETO, believe that he is the "messiah." To advance its interests, FETO believes that violating any legal, religious or ethical codes is fully legitimate. Its members excel at concealing their connection to Gulen to avert suspicion while establishing themselves in different institutions in different countries. In other words, FETO is a new-generation terrorist organization based on hypocrisy, concealment, and secrecy. Of course, all this serves their higher purpose: They see themselves as the "golden generation" destined to take control of Turkey and, believe it or not, of the world.

Gulen's desire to reign in Turkey and start a regime according to his perverted religious ethos was no secret. For decades, he directed his followers to infiltrate all critical state organs, such as the police, judiciary, and armed forces. Even when I was at college in early '90s, their younger recruits were in our midst preparing themselves for future positions. I always thought they were too obvious. No firm handshake, no genuine eye contact but a sinister approach to the needy to take advantage of them. Unfortunately, they were all too good at steering the vulnerable little by little toward becoming a servant of their perverted religious ways and political objectives.

Yet this was never only about Turkey. We are faced with a terror organization with global aspirations. FETO is active in more than 150 countries. It conceals its true nature behind a loose network of schools, NGOs seemingly promoting interfaith

dialogue, lobbyists, media outlets and companies, including in the United States. One disturbing example is the presence of more than 170 charter schools that FETO members run across the United States. These schools are supported by a whopping half-billion dollars in American taxpayers' money. It is believed that a good portion of this is funneled into darker avenues than educating American kids. Yet it is hard to believe the leader of this organization still is living in Pennsylvania in a self-imposed exile. Turkish requests of extradition have so far not been met.

However, Turkey has proven to be a resilient nation in the face of such a challenge. Stability and order were restored soon after the coup attempt. A state of emergency was declared, but it did not interfere with the daily affairs and aims at bringing the responsible to justice.

Turkey made the utmost effort not to compromise rule of law, democracy, and morality. Life continues.

We just transformed our political system into a presidential democracy in line with the results of a peaceful referendum. Turkish economy is growing at an accelerated pace recording one of the fastest growth rates in Europe supported by strong exports. Tourism is coming back in a promising way. Turkey is at the center of strategic crossroads. We have a stake in almost every remarkable international topic. Our foreign policy is much more active and assertive. Turkey is the most generous country per capita in the world accommodating more than 3 million people who fled persecution in our region, first and foremost in Syria. Turkey is a fascinating country. We always had challenges. We will always have them. Yet, we will always prevail thanks to the potential of the Turkish people.

Sunday is my last day in Miami as the Consul General of Turkey.

However, groups such as Daesh continue to take advantage of the power vacuum in neighboring Libya, and the political situation there looks unlikely to be solved any time soon.

We are therefore concerned by recent developments surrounding the new U.S. budget that will reportedly reduce aid to Tunisia by 61.1% from \$177m a year to \$54m. Tunisia continues to experience complex economic and security challenges, and we have played an important role as a strategic partner to the U.S. in the fight against international terrorism - an issue that threatens us all.

We welcome the recent call by Senator John McCain for the U.S. to retain its economic support to Tunisia and we hope that the U.S. will continue to be our ally in our democratic and economic transition. Following the news of Senator McCain's illness, we wish him all the best and a very speedy recovery.



# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI

#### President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

Tunisia continues to push ahead with social, political and economic reforms to strengthen its democratic transition. Last week, we hosted an international trade and investment forum, with over 1,500 international investors, entrepreneurs and business leaders in attendance. This was an important event that promoted Tunisia as a highly competitive and attractive business destination.

The Minister of Investment and International Cooperation, Zied Ladhari, an Ennahdha Member, played an important role in the Forum and in showcasing the potential of various sectors for investment, including our manufacturing, aeronautical, pharmaceutical and agriculture industries.

Reforms to strengthen women's rights are also an important element of strengthening our economy because Tunisian women represent a valuable part of the labor force and a majority of university graduates. I was therefore pleased to see Tunisia named the most progressive country in the Middle East and North Africa in gender equality, according to the World Economic Forum's Global Gender Gap Index. We have introduced some ground-breaking legislation in recent months, specifically around prevention and protection against all forms of gender-based violence.

Tunisia continues to represent an important example to the rest of the region, not only as a model for democracy, but also as a regional leader in important sectors, including in renewable energy and information and communication technologies. This is an exciting period for our country as we look ahead to regional elections early next year.

Ennahdha's Parliamentary Members Re-Elects Bhiri as President: On November 11, Noureddine Bhiri was re-elected as the president of Ennahdha's parliamentary bloc. Bhiri received 44 votes against Houcine Jaziri's 18 at the party's annual general assembly ahead of parliament's third session. Bhiri stated: "The parliamentary bloc of the Ennahdha Party will work to boost parliamentary action and support the legislative initiatives of the bloc and strengthen its role of control over the government and elected officials in the regions."

Parliament Finally Chooses New ISIE President: After months of delay, the Assembly of People's Representatives (ARP) selected Mohamed Tilli Mansri as the new president of the Independent High Authority for Elections (ISIE) on November 14. Mansri received 115 votes and was primarily backed by Nidaa Tounes, Ennahdha, and the Free Patriotic Union (UPL) MPs.

The Commission for Rights and Liberties and External Relations, chaired by MP Naoufel Eljammali, is considering a proposal of a draft bill for the Human Rights Commission. Mehrezia Labidi stressed that democracy is intertwined with the successful establishment of such bodies and suggested that the body should be a path for youth involvement, as she deems the entry requirement of ten years' experience unfair.

The Commission of Industry, Energy, Natural Resources, Infrastructure and Environment, chaired by Ameur Larayedh MP, held a hearing with the Minister of Communication Technologies and the Digital Economy Mr. Anouar Maarouf. The Minister gave a presentation on the most important achievements of 2017, which exceeded objectives that were set last year.



# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCH!

President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

I would like to begin by taking the opportunity to wish you all a healthy and prosperous start to the new year. Looking back at 2017, Tunisia and the Ennahdha Party have much to be proud of, including the landmark Law on Eliminating Violence Against Women as a legal protection against domestic abuse and various economic reforms that will support the growth of Tunisia's economy and spread wealth across the country. In 2018, we are confident that Tunisia will continue to be an exemplar for the region more widely.

I am delighted that the Independent High Authority for Elections Council has confirmed that the municipal elections will take place on 6 May 2018. As President of the Ennahdha Party, I have consistently supported these elections, which will act as a crucial next step for Tunisia's strengthening democracy. Tunisia's post-revolution constitution emphasizes the importance of decentralization and local democracy for a healthy political and civil society.

In a further demonstration of Tunisia's and Ennahdha's commitment to social progress, the Tunisian parliament has approved a draft <u>Council of Europe Convention report</u> which aims to prevent and combat the sexual exploitation and abuse of children. This report is in line with Ennahdha MP Yamina Zoghlami's proposal to introduce sexual education in schools for pupils as young as five years old, working according to the ethos that a child who understands their body can better protect themselves from potential harm. From giving assistance to victims to implementing protective measures, safeguarding the rights of all Tunisians, including our children, has my committed support.

Separately, over the past days, several Tunisian regions have witnessed protests in response to the 2018 budget. The Ennahdha Party acknowledges the right of Tunisian citizens to protest, but strongly condemns any vandalism or violence, and therefore calls on those with legitimate demands to make their voices heard calmly, rationally, and in adherence to the rule of law. Ennahdha has been – and continues to be – at the forefront of developing and implementing the economic reforms capable of producing prosperity in the years to come. We recognize that there is a need to cut our country's deficit, but emphasize that the needs and concerns of low-income groups should always be taken into account when developing and implementing any budget cuts.

# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI

President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

While attending the World Economic Forum at Davos last week, I was delighted by the level of international support for Tunisia's political and economic transition. Indeed, Tunisia is an open country, and the event provided an excellent opportunity to meet with world leaders both past and present to discuss the challenges and rich opportunities open to Tunisia.

Tunisia's position as the sole success story of the Arab Spring was widely referenced throughout the week at Davos, and the consensus regarding the potential of our country was overwhelming. Although this is a source of great national pride, it is important to remember that as a relatively new democracy we are not immune to teething problems. This was made evident by the recent social unrest in the country. Indeed, Tunisians are not afraid to voice discontent, which famously sparked the Arab Spring and rid Tunisia of a despot following years of rampant cronyism under the Ben Ali regime.

Since this important event we have sought to create a truly democratic society, one that enables our citizens to reach their full potential while enjoying the freedoms that many in the West take for granted, such as national elections, freedom of the press, functional institutions, and most importantly, security.

Despite the testing economic and political conditions following the overthrow of Ben Ali, we have managed to complete several rounds of free and fair elections, implement landmark gender equality laws, draft new laws to encourage foreign investment, and most recently we have agreed on a final date of May 6, 2018 for important municipal elections – the first of their kind in the region.

All these developments are important building blocks for Tunisia's young democracy and the Tunisian people should be proud of having achieved this, seven years after the Arab Spring. In order to further strengthen the Tunisian democracy and stimulate the economy, I urge the Tunisian people to give our unique democratic transition their continuous and full support. It is via the ballot box, and not on the streets, where Tunisians can most effectively voice their opinion on the running of the country.

The Ennahdha Party will continue to work hard to ensure citizens' concerns are represented in government. Only together we can make Tunisia stronger.



# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI

We now have just 46 days until the Tunisian municipal elections. On May 6, Tunisia will take another step towards the implementation of the post-Revolution constitution. However, it can never be said enough, it is not just that the elections take place, but how they take place, that is important.

Ennahdha was steadfast in its support for gender parity on the election lists, and as the only party to put forward candidates in all municipalities, we will be fielding the highest number of female candidates. As a party, we have ensured – as mandated by electoral law – that there is horizontal and vertical parity, with 175 women leading the lists out of 350 in total.

Indeed, our strength in gender equality was recently recognized in the recent meeting of the Arab League in Gammarth, Tunisia. The meeting, entitled Women for Safe Societies in the Arab Region, convened eleven ministers for women's affairs from member states. At the meetings conclusion, it was decided that Tunisia would be the 2018-19 Capital of Arab Women, a direct recognition of the country's progressive politics. We hope that this will strengthen our hand not just domestically, but in our effort to become the regional exemplar for gender equality.

It is in this spirit that we approach the municipal elections in May, which will be the most inclusive the country has ever experienced.


Notable progress has been made in implementing the law around the municipal elections, ensuring the proper functioning of local governance. Amendments to the law have been deposited by Ennahdha, with discussions and voting set to begin on next week in plenary. In particular, the amendments will reinforce the importance of women's role in the elections. Ennahdha is working hard to ensure this law is passed before the end of March, ahead of campaigning beginning on April 14.

The Tunisian Parliament is continuing to negotiate around the selection of members to the Constitutional Court. Three of these four members will have a specialized legal competence, while the remaining member will offer a separate specialty. Negotiations are ongoing, with all involved determined to select the appropriate people. The first member has been elected, a female judge named Roudha Wirsghini. The remaining three members will be elected on March 21.

# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI

President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

On March 20 Tunisia celebrated the 62nd anniversary of its independence. A day of national celebration, this event marked the beginning of Tunisia's first republic. The 2011 Revolution marked the beginning of Tunisia's second republic, which aims to build on Tunisia's social and economic achievements while grounding them in a set of new democratic institutions that work for everyone.

Significantly, it is now just 38 days until the country's first municipal elections. Just as Tunisia's independence marked a new beginning, so too will these elections, as they mark the birth of a new decentralized governance framework. Decentralizing power away from the capital is so important because it gives those who have been politically disenfranchised – the young, women, people from marginalized regions – a real stake in the country's future. This is why I passionately urge the country to turn out on May 6 to give a new generation of representatives the mandate they need to deliver local development and prosperity.

Clearly, the support of our international partners is key as Tunisia consolidates its democracy. French President Emmanuel Macron's visit in Fébruary is a perfect case in point. Mr. Macron commended Tunisia for having carried out a "cultural revolution" since 2011, as well as having "given the lie to those who say that societies where Islam is present are not compatible with democracy."

The European Union's support is also key, and our political and economic dialogue has continually increased since the establishment of the Privileged Partnership in 2012. Today, the EU is Tunisia's primary trading partner, accounting for 63 percent of our total trade.

Our program of cooperation also extends further afield. In 2018 alone, Tunisia formally extended bilateral relations with countries from Nigeria to China, Spain to Indonesia. Truly demonstrating our openness on the world stage, Equatorial Guinea announced last month that it would soon open an embassy in Tunisia.

The 62nd anniversary of Tunisia's independence is of course a time of celebration. But it is essential that we now look forward. The municipal elections on May 6 will represent yet another step in the fulfilment of our democratic Constitution, and we call on our international partners to continue to support us during this crucial stage of Tunisia's development.

Elections for members of the Constitutional Court will be held again at a later date, after parliamentary blocks failed to produce a quorum. Of the four candidates, only one was successfully elected during voting last week.

Tunisia's parliament is in contentious discussions over extending the mandate of the **Truth and Dignity Commission**, the body tasked with implementing post-revolution transitional justice. The debate centers on whether its mandate should be extended for another year once it expires in June 2018.

Plenary discussions and voting sessions are ongoing this week in the House of the People's Representatives. Under consideration is the Local Governance Code of 1975 which is to be revoked and replaced with an upcoming draft law that will unify all local government organization in one legal framework. The law, known as the Code on Local Authorities, will serve as the basis for Tunisia's first-ever municipal elections. We look forward to reaching consensus, though there are yet more than 400 points to be discussed and amended.


Ennahdha supports preserving the **Carthage Declaration**, a 2016 agreement between Tunisia's political parties that outlines the goals of the national unity government. However, Ennahdha has called for the formation of a commission to study political performance. The party has also proposed legislative revisions for the economic, political, social, and education sectors.

# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI

On Saturday, Tunisians welcomed the beginning of the campaign for the municipal elections, which will take place on May 6. The first of their kind in the region, the elections will decentralize power to municipalities across the country, empower the previously disenfranchised and represent yet another step in the fulfilment of the post-Revolution Constitution.

Ennahdha Party set off on the campaign trail on April 14, with Party representatives travelling throughout the country to promote the Party's program of economic, social and political reform, and connect with communities on a more personal level to better understand their ideas for the future and motivate them to actively partake in building Tunisia's democracy. Bringing decision-making closer to the people most closely affected is, after all, the very essence of democracy.

Pressing ahead with our commitment to economic reform, Ennahdha was recently pivotal in securing the passing of a very important law in Parliament that promises to bring greater economic dynamism and innovation. On April 2, the Start-up Act, a bill proposed by the Ennahdha Minister for Communication Technologies and Digital Economy, Anouar Maarouf, was approved in Parliament. The Act will make it easier for companies to be created and flourish, and has been received very well domestically — not at all a surprise, given Tunisia's position at number 40 on the 2018 Global Entrepreneurship Index, showing that the country is making solid economic progress.

Tunis was also recently the venue for the Islamic Development Bank's annual meeting – a successful event that convened 75 delegations including 43 finance ministers and high dignitaries. Several agreements were signed between Tunisia and the IDB during the meeting, driven in large part by the work of the Ennahdha Minister for Development, Investment and International Cooperation, Zied Ladhari. These agreements, as Mr. Ladhari has said, will help to address the regional disparities in Tunisia through the financing of different projects in sectors as diverse as energy, education and health.

Last week, I led an Ennahdha Party delegation to Brussels to strengthen key relationships with our friends in Europe. Strengthening Ennahdha's ties with EU decision makers is an essential component of our international outreach, as we continue to address some of the challenges we face; some unique to Tunisia, some common to us all. This was perhaps best demonstrated by my fruitful meeting with Federica Mogherini, High Representative of the European Union for Foreign Affairs and Security Policy, where I expressed Ennahdha's commitment for close cooperation on democratic reforms, economic modernization and migration issues.

And so, as Ennahdha begins its campaigning for the first ever democratic local elections in our country's history, I am excited at what the future holds for our Party and country alike. Implementing decentralization and other deep reforms will be essential in delivering the prosperous and democratic Tunisia for which we all continue to strive.

Tunisia's parliament passed the Start-up Act, an Ennahdha-led initiative that will remove hurdles for entrepreneurs and investors as they found and build their companies. Among the measures included in the law, which was spearheaded by Ennahdha Minister of Communication Technologies and Digital Economy Anouar Maarouf, are:

- · Exemption for start-ups from corporate taxes for up to eight years;
- Exemption from capital gains tax on investments made in start-ups;
- . Up to one year off from their current jobs (both private and public sector employees), and;
- A salary for up to three founders during the first year of a company's operation.

The law passed without any significant opposition, and has been very well received in Tunisia, particularly among the country's youth.


The Law on Local Governance is under debate in plenary. Although still a work in progress, the draft law represents the next step in laying the necessary foundations for strong, decentralized Tunisian institutions, and we are hopeful it will be passed ahead of the municipal elections on May 6.





# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI

President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

Campaigning is well and truly under way ahead of Tunisia's municipal elections on May 6. The elections will be a key milestone in the history of post-Revolution Tunisia, and a starting point for democratically decentralising power down to regional and local authorities.

We launched Ennahdha's campaign on April 14 with a clear message: these elections represent a huge opportunity for strengthening reform and development, and consolidating democracy and freedom. The sheer number and diversity of enthusiastic and hardworking Tunisians who put themselves forward to run on Ennahdha's electoral lists, whether party members or independent, has re-affirmed my belief that the country's appetite for robust, local democracy is extremely strong. The fact that over 50% are young people under 35 also gives great hope for renewal and innovation at the local level.

Democracy is about people, which is why I – alongside other Party representatives – have accompanied our candidates to campaigning events over the past weeks. Everywhere we went, we met the municipalities' inspiring female candidates, in whose ability to drive positive local change I have total confidence. As the head of a party with 50% women and 50% men across all our 350 electoral lists, I am proud to see the emergence of female political leaders across the political spectrum throughout the entire country.

The importance of free and fair elections cannot be understated and, to this end, Ennahdha welcomes the delegation of more than 80 election observers from the European Union. # **EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE UPDATES**

The Law on Local Governance has successfully passed through Parliament. With the persistent and committed support and participation of Ennahdha MP's, the Code on Local Governance was passed on Thursday April 26. The Code, which lays out the responsibilities of regional and local councils, is an important achievement that sets the foundations for the consolidation of democracy and transfer of power to Tunisia's municipalities. Among other aspects, the new Code includes amendments to municipal powers, giving them greater powers to take decisions concerning local development without needing to go back to central authority. The Code also guarantees the financial and administrative independence of local authorities and ensures that the central state cannot directly intervene in municipal decisions unless through judicial proceedings. In addition, the Code encourages the principle of participatory democracy, and obliges local authorities to involve citizens in local decision-making.

Ennahdha condemns the opening of the American embassy in Jerusalem and the crimes of killing and detention committed against the Palestinian people

In an unprecedented move, the U.S. administration on May 14, 2018, implemented its decision to move its embassy to Jerusalem in a flagrant violation of UN resolutions and international consensus, constituting a new Nakba for Palestinians and providing the Israeli occupation with a cover to further escalate its attacks on Palestinians in Jerusalem, Gaza and the West Bank, and expand its raids on the holy sanctuary (Haram Sharif) in Jerusalem and its attempts to take full control of the city and erase its Arab and Muslim history.

The Israeli occupation committed a massacre today against the "Return demonstration" in Gaza, killing dozens and injuring hundreds of Palestinians.

#### Ennahdha Party:

- Strongly condemns the opening of the U.S. embassy in Jerusalem and considers it a clear violation of UN resolutions and of the Palestinian people's right to liberation from occupation and establishing its independent state with Jerusalem as its capital.

Tunisia's parliament reached a quorum this week on both the Social Justice Law and the Law for Constitutional Bodies. The draft laws will be transferred back to the Consensus Committee for further approval.

The Rights and Liberties and Foreign Affairs Committee, Chaired by Ennahdha MP Naoufel Eljammali, held a hearing this week on racial discrimination, in preparation for a law against racism that will be unique in North Africa.

Members of the Tunisian Assembly of the Representatives of the People will soon vote again for the remaining three members of the Constitutional Court as the parliament is registering candidacies. The first member was elected several weeks before the municipal elections.



Ennahdha is delighted to announce that Souad Abderrahim, who ran on an Ennahdha list during May's municipal elections, has been elected as the first female mayor of Tunis, making her the first elected female mayor in the Arab world. Of the 68 female mayors elected in the 349 municipalities, 42 are from Ennahdha — an impressive 62 percent. Each of our female mayors ran inspiring campaigns, always epitomizing the party's plurality and embrace of modern values. It is for this reason that we have no doubt that they will all be effective and tireless representatives of Tunisian people of all political persuasions.

Aside from progress in gender equality. Ennahdha continues to build broader momentum in the wake of May's municipal elections. The party is delighted to have the presidencies of 132 municipalities, including the second city and economic capital, Sfax, and the cultural capital, Kairouan.

Elsewhere, the World Bank has approved a new \$500 million loan to support economic reform in Tunisia followed by a further \$249m loan tranche instalment from the IMF. Ennahdha has always been clear that Tunisia's route to prosperity is best mapped out with the support of our international partners and friends, and this financial support is a welcome development as we seek to attract private investment and provide a safety net to the most vulnerable in society.

Intense discussions continue to be held around Carthage II, the document that determines Tunisia's economic and social priorities. Ennahdha's position remains clear: governmental stability and consensus is necessary to ensure the country can continue to devote its primary attention to an ambitious and necessary program of political, economic and social reform.

Despite the challenges which any country undergoing reform can expect to face, Tunisia has made exceptional strides in the first half of 2018. In addition to holding the region's first democratic municipal elections, the Ennahdha-led Startup Act is well positioned to instill an entrepreneurial spirit in the country. A separate law against racial discrimination, also spearheaded by Ennahdha, continues to make progress through Parliament. Alongside economic reform, these legislative developments act as a positive platform upon which to build from in the remainder of 2018, ahead of next year's legislative and presidential elections.

# **EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE UPDATES**

Tunisian parliament is taking steps to enshrine in law the requirement of companies in both the public and private sectors to commit funds for the preservation of the environment as well as social program in the cities where they are based. Ennahdha was instrumental in drafting the law, which would allow companies to deduct giving from their taxes. The measure will ensure the contribution of funds to cultural programs, as well as to the health and education sectors.

An Ennahdha-proposed bill would require politicians and government employees to declare all types of revenue and priority. The law is designed to encourage transparency and accountability for public officials, as well as reinforce the country's already-existing anti-corruption measures. Politicians will also have to declare their revenue after leaving their official positions. The bill is expected to attract strong support in Parliament.

Parliament is in early discussions with civil society on a bill that would update <u>protection of personal data</u> <u>for Tunisians</u>. Such a bill would follow a previous transparency law which guarantees transparency and free access to data for Tunisian citizens.

Four years on from the adoption of the post-revolution Constitution, one primary step remains in the effort to achieve a truly decentralizzed Tunisian government. On May 6, 2018, the country will implement decentralization-decentralization-in-practice through our first municipal elections – a significant landmark not just for Tunisia, but also for the wider region.

The revolution in 2011 marked the beginning of Tunisia's development into a regional democratic exemplar. In 2017, several laws – such as the landmark legislation combatting violence against women – were implemented at the national level, with Ennahdha representatives habitually driving change. The municipal elections are both significant and exciting because they will allow the country to extend this programme of reform to the local level. Ennahdha and Nidaa Tounes were the only parties to submit lists of candidates for municipal elections across all 350 constituencies before the February 22 deadling. February 22 was the deadline to submit lists of candidates for the municipal elections, with only Ennahdha and Nidaa Tounes able to submit our lists across all 350 constituencies. This demonstrates the strength of the party across the entire country.

However, it is not just that the elections take place, but how they take place, that is important. Ennahdha is extremely proud to announce that we have nominated a member of the Tunisian Jewish community. Simon Selame, as an independent representative for Monastir in the country's upcoming elections. Although Ennahdha is proud to have Muslim origins, we are a modern political party that is open to people from all religious backgrounds, as Mr Selame clearly recognizes recognizes. He stated that he would not have accepted the nomination from any other party.

Meanwhille, Ennahdha representative Meherzia Labidi has visited the interior regions of Tunisia to speak with Tunisian women and motivate them to become active in politics, in the municipal elections, approximately 50 percent% of local seats will have to be occupied while one candidate out of the first 10 on a list must be an individual with physical disabilities. Collectively, these measures contribute to making these elections, not only the first of its kind in Tunisia, but also the most diverse Tunisia has ever seenin our history.

The Enrahdha Party is pleased to have won in 155 out of 350 municipalities in the recent municipal elections. While the elections were an historic milestone for Tunisian democracy, focus has now shifted to the national issues vital to Tunisia's development.

The mandate of the independent and constitutionally-backed Truth and Dignity Commission (IVD), created in 2014 to address human rights violations committed by the pre-Revolution regime and provide justice to victims, formally came to a close this week. Tunisia's parliament decided that the IVD would have to end its work and release a final report by the end of 2018. At the same time, on Wednesday, May 29, we witnessed in Gabès an historic event: the first trial from the tyrannous years of the 1990s involving an Ennahdha Party activist, Kamel Matmati, who was killed under torture by the Ben Ali regime. Our position is clear: transitional justice is an important component of Tunisia's healing process, and the Commission's work must be able to continue. Tunisians must understand the past and reconcile with it so we can move forward together.

A committee of experts comprised of political party leaders and civil society groups and known as the National Symposium last week agreed to implement 63 'points' on social and economic reforms as part of an updated Carthage Declaration. However, the signatories to the Symposium, which is tasked with determining the priorities of the National Unity Government, failed to reach an agreement on the immediate future of the Tunisian Prime Minister. While some groups have called for a complete government reshuffle, Ennahdha has expressed opposition to pursuing such a course at this time. A reshuffle would run counter to the country's interests, which right now call for economic and political stability.

Just as Tunisia has implemented reforms on a platform of consensus and dialogue, it is essential that our international partners continue to support the country's progress towards economic and political stability. It is

in this context of international collaboration that Tunisia can drive the economic prosperity the country is capable of achieving.

#### **ENNAHDHA & TUNISIA UPDATES**

Statement: Ennahdha Renaissance party supports the findings of the Committee of Experts and stresses the importance of government stability – May 24

The Ennahdha Renaissance Party Executive Committee held its regular meeting on Wednesday, May 23, 2018 under the supervision of its President Rached Ghannouchi. The Committee reviewed a number of files related to the general situation in the country, and expressed the following:

- 1. The Party supports the findings of the Committee of Experts after several meetings and consensus on 63 points out of 64, all of which stressed the projects to be activated, and the necessary reform measures to enhance the national economy, rebalance public finances, stimulate growth and investment, which would contribute to job creation and the development of marginalized parts of the country. It also stresses the urgent need for the government to enact major reforms.
- 2. The Party stresses the importance of governmental stability, which is not affected by the necessary partial reshuffle, and the importance of continuing the dialogue approach in addressing the country's issues. The Party believes that the forum of the Presidents of parties and organizations signatories of the Carthage Agreement, under the President's supervision is an appropriate framework to overcome the differences regarding the future status of the government.
- 3. The Party reiterates its commitment to the formation of municipal councils on the basis of the commitment to achieve the interests of citizens, away from political disputes, and on the criteria of efficiency and placing public interest before every consideration in order to ensure their effectiveness and ability to carry out the tasks entrusted to them, including local development and providing local services.

# Ennahdha Renaissance Party Statement following the 20th Session of its Consultative Council — May 28

On Sunday, May 27 2018, Ennahdha Renaissance Party Consultative Council held its 20th session in Tunis, during which the general situation in the country and the results of the recent municipal elections were examined, in addition to the negotiation results presented by the Committee of experts of the Carthage Agreement 2. After hearing reports from the Executive Bureau, Ennahdha Renaissance Consultative Council:

1. Sends its greetings to all Tunisian people, State institutions, the Independent High Authority for Elections (ISIE), all political parties, civil society and independent organizations who have contributed to the success of the national local elections. It also calls for deepening consolidation and consensus among all the winners in order

to install stable and efficient municipal councils that provide the best services to citizens and strengthen local administration and local democracy.

- 2. Appreciates the efforts of the President of the Republic Beji Caid Essebsi in supporting the dialogue of Carthage Agreement 2 and his keepness in ensuring the powers of State institutions to enhance our country's leading role and uphold the rule of law.
- 3. The Council also approved the 63 points contained in the Carthage Agreement 2 and mandated the Party President to continue his dialogue with other political and social parties in a manner that would ensure stability and support the path of national unity and the concordance that characterized our Tunisian experience over the past years.

#### **EXECUTIVE AND LEGISLATIVE UPDATES**

On May 24, MPs continued to discuss the Law Against Racial Discrimination in the Rights and Liberties and Foreign Affairs committee, chaired by Ennahdha Minister Naoufel El Jammali. The Committee is approaching the law in a comprehensive manner, considering any discriminations which may unfairly impact a certain group, while guaranteeing human rights protections. The Law, which has achieved consensus in Parliament, will be the first of its kind in the Maghreb.

The Commission of Agriculture, Food Security, Trade and Related Services, chaired by Ennahdha MP Zoubair Rajbi, held a session on Thursday, May 24, 2018, during which the Committee's report on the draft law on health and safety, quality of food products and animal feed was presented and approved unanimously by MPs.

On May 22, Parliament continued to review the 2013-2015 budget for Tunisia, as discussions around how best to structure the country's finances continue to take place. This is an important step for the critical aim of ensuring stability as Tunisia enters a period of political, economic and social reform.

<u>Parliament continues to vote on the third protocol on the convention of children's rights.</u> This convention will build on the region's first Law on Violence Against Women passed last year, and will cover an array of additional rights for children.



# A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

Ennahdha is delighted to announce that Souad Abderrahim, who ran on an Ennahdha list during May's municipal elections, has been elected as the first female mayor of Tunis, making her the first elected female mayor in the Arab world. Of the 68 female mayors elected in the 349 municipalities, 42 are from Ennahdha – an impressive 62 percent. Each of our female mayors ran inspiring campaigns, always epitomizing the party's plurality and embrace of modern values. It is for this reason that we have no doubt that they will all be effective and tireless representatives of Tunisian people of all political persuasions.

Aside from progress in gender equality, Ennahdha continues to build broader momentum in the wake of May's municipal elections. The party is delighted to have the presidencies of 132 municipalities, including the second city and economic capital, Sfax, and the cultural capital, Kairouan.

Elsewhere, the World Bank has approved a new \$500 million loan to support economic reform in Tunisia followed by a further \$249m loan tranche instalment from the IMF. Ennahdha has always been clear that Tunisia's route to prosperity is best mapped out with the support of our international partners and friends, and this financial support is a welcome development as we seek to attract private investment and provide a safety net to the most vulnerable in society.

Intense discussions continue to be held around Carthage II, the document that determines Tunisia's economic and social priorities. Ennahdha's position remains clear: governmental stability and consensus is necessary to ensure the country can continue to devote its primary attention to an ambitious and necessary program of

political, economic and social reform.

Despite the challenges which any country undergoing reform can expect to face, Tunisia has made exceptional strides in the first half of 2018. In addition to holding the region's first democratic municipal elections, the Ennahdha-led Startup Act is well positioned to instill an entrepreneurial spirit in the country. A separate law against racial discrimination, also spearheaded by Ennahdha, continues to make progress through Parliament. Alongside economic reform, these legislative developments act as a positive platform upon which to build from in the remainder of 2018, ahead of next year's legislative and presidential elections.

# **EXECUTIVE & LEGISLATIVE UPDATES**

Tunisian parliament is taking steps to enshrine in law the requirement of companies in both the public and private sectors to commit funds for the preservation of the environment as well as social program in the cities where they are based. Ennahdha was instrumental in drafting the law, which would allow companies to deduct giving from their taxes. The measure will ensure the contribution of funds to cultural programs, as well as to the health and education sectors.

An Ennahdha-proposed bill would require politicians and government employees to declare all types of revenue and priority. The law is designed to encourage transparency and accountability for public officials, as well as reinforce the country's already-existing anti-corruption measures. Politicians will also have to declare their revenue after leaving their official positions. The bill is expected to attract strong


support in Parliament.

Parliament is in early discussions with civil society on a bill that would update protection of personal data for Tunisians. Such a bill would follow a previous transparency law which guarantees transparency and free access to data for Tunisian citizens.

## A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI

### President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

In what is a significant year ahead for Tunisia with parliamentary and presidential elections set for 2019, I would like to reflect on some of the important developments affecting the country today.

As recent headlines have shown, Tunisian President Beji Caid Essebsi recently suggested that Ennahdha had chosen to break ties with him and his party, Nidaa Tounes. Whilst we may have differences over some areas of policy – which is itself normal in any healthy democracy – we stressed that dialogue and consensus remains best course of action to resolve those differences.

Unfortunately, the president made this pronouncement not simply because of a policy disagreement, but because Ennahdha has declined to support his calls for the Prime Minister to step down and for change of government to step in. Ennahdha remains committed to the notion that changing the government one year before parliamentary and presidential elections would at best cause unnecessary disruption, and at worst prevent crucial reforms from being implemented for the good of the economy. Although we do not agree with the president on this point, we still value the role he has played in Tunisia's democratic transition and remain committed to dialogue and consensus between all political stakeholders.

Indeed, political stability and democratic consolidation was a key focal point during the recent EU-Tunisia joint committee meeting that took place in Tunis on September 18. The mixed parliamentary commission spoke highly of the effectiveness of May's municipal elections, as well as post-Revolution laws strengthening political transparency. Pleasingly, those present stressed the utility of cooperation between the

EU and Tunisian parliaments. Just as dialogue is essential in Tunisia, so too will our country benefit from collaborating closely with our European friends.

In recent weeks, there has been much discussion around equal inheritance rights in Tunisia, proposed by the President's Individual Freedoms and Equality Committee. This is a sensitive issue for many families across Tunisia, and Ennahdha sees great value in a national dialogue on the issue to allow us to reach a conclusion best for all in society. Dialogue, after all, has contributed to strong economic and political progress in Tunisia since the 2011 revolution.

As a party we look forward to engaging with this legislation when it is presented to parliament. It does, however, remain our conviction that Tunisians should be free to live their lives in accordance with the fundamental tenets of their religious beliefs.

On the economic front, I am delighted to confirm that Tunisia's GDP is at its highest level since 2016. Preliminary results from the second quarter of 2018 confirm this uptrend, and suggest that the country could achieve its target of 3 percent growth. Although tourism and agriculture are driving results, it is extremely important that Tunisia's economy diversifies. I am pleased that a wide range of sectors, including agribusiness, textiles and chemicals, are contributing positively to these results.

All of this should rightly fill Tunisians, as well as our international partners, with optimism as the country's economy enters the final quarter of 2018.

# **ENNAHDHA AND TUNISIA UPDATES**

Ennahdha calls for continued dialogue with the President - September 25

Following the interview conducted with the President of the Republic on Al-Hiwar al-Tounisi channel on Monday September 24, 2018 during which a number of important issues of concern to national public opinion, Ennahdha Party:

- 1. Commends the President of the Republic's commitment to reassuring Tunisians regarding holding the next presidential and legislative elections on the agreed dates, which would strengthen the democratic transition process and strengthen internal and external confidence in #Tunisia.
- 2. Reaffirms its commitment to consensus with the President of the Republic and its appreciation of the national role he has played since the beginning of the revolution in order to establish a culture of consultation and dialogue between political parties as opposed to monopolization, exclusion and conflict. Ennahdha Party had reacted positively to that approach since the Paris meeting, as embodied at all phases during which the President of the Republic found nothing but support and cooperation. The Tunisian exception owes its existence to the path of consensus-building which remains the ideal basis for our country's stability and managing differences within the framework of national responsibility and mutual respect.
- 3. Stresses the difference in points of view on a number of issues faced by the country, foremost amongst which is the government's stability, does not mean Ennahdha's abandonment of the robust relationship with the President of the Republic, but is rather part of the essence of democratic life and among the requirements of the critical phase and immense economic and social challenges preoccupying national public opinion.

Many areas of #Nabeul, Benarous, Sousse and other parts of the country witnessed

exceptionally high levels of rainfall last month. Valleys were flooded leading to a rise in water levels which resulted in casualties, road blocks, traffic disruptions and the flooding of a many homes, establishments and institutions. In the face of the calamity that has struck these areas, Ennahdha Party, while it values all the efforts made by the National Office of Civil Protection (NOCP), the <u>#Tunisia</u> National Guard, the Army, the Security Forces and all the parties involved in reducing human losses and material damages:

- 1. Pays respect to the souls of the victims and offers its condolences to their families and relatives, and wishes a speedy recovery for those that have been wounded.
- 2. Salutes the movement of broad solidarity among Tunisian citizens which reflected the depth of social cohesion and the values of humanity and civilisation.
- 3. Calls upon its activists and supporters to attend to those affected and to support the efforts of the government and civil society.
- 4. Calls upon the Government to take all measures required to mitigate the impact of the disaster and reduce its negative effect on the lives of the afflicted and to promptly assess the damages.

Ennahdha's statement on recent calls for the postponement of 2019 elections

August 30

Following the doubts raised regarding holding the presidential and legislative elections as scheduled for late 2019, Ennahdha, out of its full commitment to preserving the democratic transition process:

1. Affirms that freedom from dictatorship and the embodiment of free popular will are

realised through holding elections within their set constitutional deadlines, t hereby completing the establishment of our democratic system. Without elections, there is no legitimacy; and any questioning of the electoral process is a deviation from the path of democratic transition.

- 2. Expresses its pride in <u>#Tunisia</u>'s well-established democratic path, which consolidates freedom which was a principal demand of the revolution of the people of Tunisia in 2011, with the full commitment of our political elite to democracy and to the peaceful alternation of power.
- 3. Reiterates its commitment to consensus before and after the elections regardless of the results, based on the outcome of the ballot box and in light of the need of our young democratic experience to broad partnership in order to manage public affairs and ensure the continued success of the Tunisian model.

#### Ennahdha's statement on National Women's Day - August 13

Tunisian women and the whole Tunisian people proudly celebrate today the anniversary of the 13th of August, 1956, the promulgation date of the Personal Status Code.

On the occasion of celebrating this anniversary, Ennahdha Party:

- 1. Congratulates all Tunisian women and men inside and outside the country, and salutes the leading role played by Tunisian women in all fields in order to build the new Tunisia.
- 2. Congratulates the Tunisian people in general, and in particular, Tunisian women, for assuming local leadership within the elected municipal councils, as members,

mayors, or heads of committees.

- 3. Calls for further empowerment of Tunisian women and supporting their participation in decision-making, and for the adoption of horizontal and vertical gender parity in the coming legislative elections in order to further strengthen women's contribution to leading change and renewal in our country.
- 4. Calls for the adoption of the necessary mechanisms and measures in order to activate the law on the prevention of violence against women so as to enable us to put an end to this dangerous phenomenon.

The Tunisian parliament returned from recess on October 2.

Ennahdha's Naoufel El Jammai, Chairman of the Committee on Rights and Freedoms and Foreign Relations, addressed MPs in a plenary session on October 2 regarding key issues around the agenda for the new Parliamentary term. Mr Jammali informed MPs that one area of focus will be the new National Instance for Human Rights, an institution that Mr Jammali's Committee has developed. Ennahdha considered it important to present this progress to the new Parliament before the elections of the new Committee Chairs, estimated to be within one month.

On Monday, October 29, 2018, Habib Bourguiba Avenue in the capital Tunis witnessed a treacherous attack on a security patrol located in the vicinity, resulting in a number of casualties.

## Ennahdha statement on false allegations by the Popular Front

### A WORD FROM RACHED GHANNOUCHI President and Co-Founder of the ENNAHDHA PARTY

With parliamentary and presidential elections set for 2019, Tunisia is at the threshold of a momentous year in its history. Along with preparation for the elections, Tunisia is establishing a number of key institutions and legal texts that further entrench and consolidate its democratic system.

On October 9, the Tunisian parliament, under the guidance of Dr. Naoufel Eljammali MP, then chair of the Rights and Liberties and Foreign Affairs committee, passed the "Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination" Act. As the first Arab and Muslim country to abolish slavery in 1846, Tunisia is now one of the first in the region to criminalize racism. By defining and criminalizing racial discrimination, this law is a significant step toward a just and equitable future for all Tunisians.

Parliament's approval of a separate law establishing a National Human Rights

Commission also moves Tunisia ever closer to the ideals set out in its 2014

constitution. This new independent body, mandated under the constitution, will have broad power to monitor for human rights violations, including through visits to detention centers, prisons, and public educational, health and social institutions. The commission's unanimous approval by all lawmakers present at the vote signals an encouraging cross-party commitment to mechanisms that protect all our futures.

Comprising judges, psychologists, lawyers and members of Tunisian civil society, the commission is designed to represent the values of equality, justice and political inclusion that sparked the 2011 Revolution.

The Ennahdha Party Annual Conference on October 26-27 brought together party members and leaders from across the country to discuss key policy issues and Ennahdha's vision for Tunisia in the coming years. The conference was, in particular, an opportunity to engage newly elected mayors from Ennahdha and give central importance to local issues within Ennahdha's vision of democratic governance.

To bridge the gaps in Tunisian society, we must also pursue reconciliation and national unity. The approval of a new cabinet by parliament on November 12 will undoubtedly help to achieve this goal, providing a basis for stable government of coalition and much-needed economic reforms. Having suffered under Tunisia's two former authoritarian regimes, Ennahdha understands the power of national dialogue and the need for forgiveness to overcome division. We therefore call on Parliament to adopt a reconciliation law, which would apply to cases in which offenders admit their crimes, reveal the truth and apologize to and compensate their victims. Only by coming together can we hope to build a democratic, united and prosperous Tunisia.

#### **ENNAHDHA PARTY CONFERENCE UPDATE**

Excerpts from Ennahdha Party President Rached Ghannouchi's Opening Speech to the 2018 Annual Party Conference - October 27

Ladies and gentlemen,

Esteemed guests,

We are pleased to inaugurate the activities of the Ennahdha Party's second annual conference, which will deal with several important national and party matters. The holding of this conference will provide a space for dialogue and consultation, and a platform for scrutinizing the party's policies and priorities.

This conference also takes place between two important moments in our democratic transition: the moment when our country successfully completed its first local elections on May 6, 2018, and the moment we are approaching with the second legislative and presidential elections at the end of 2019.

Our success in the recent local elections marks the beginning of a new test of our ability to strengthen local governance, and to bring forth a talented generation of grassroots leaders, in which young people and women hold a significant proportion of senior positions. This reflects our conviction that empowering youth and women and opening doors for them to assume public office is a key priority.

Our country has been living through a political crisis for some time that has weakened the public landscape and deepened the difficulties of our democratic transition, which are mainly the continuation of structural economic challenges. Major reforms have been delayed in many sectors and institutions, despite the remarkable improvement in many economic indicators, the recovery in the tourism sector, and an improved trade balance.

Since the Carthage 2 dialogue, Ennahdha has clearly expressed its position on this crisis, stressing the country's need for political stability, improved government performance on economic and social issues, progress on major reforms, and combating corruption.

Through active diplomacy within the framework of our country's foreign policy, Ennahdha has sought to promote Tunisia as an attractive destination for investment and trade. This outreach has also sought to strengthen Tunisia's relations with a number of neighboring and friendly countries, particularly in North Africa and the Arab and Muslim worlds. Tunisian-African relations must be taken seriously as Tunisia's future lies in Africa. For this purpose, we call for the creation of a ministry or department specifically focused on African relations.

Ennahdha are also forming a team of experts from across the country to prepare a comprehensive economic and social vision for Tunisia 2030. We will present this vision to Tunisia within our electoral manifesto for 2019. This vision will present a strategic

approach drawing on our country's points of strength including its exceptional geostrategic position, enlightened cultural and civilizational heritage, advanced and competent human resources, and constructive and fruitful international relations.

We want this vision to draw the outlines of the path towards an historic leap on the economic, developmental, social, financial and civilizational levels, achieving our dream of a prosperous, strong and shining Tunisia.

In its transition to democracy, Tunisia has achieved a great deal despite the difficulties and obstacles it has faced. This is thanks to the choice of dialogue as the primary approach to the management of public affairs, and consensus, which Ennahdha considers to be the best means to achieving national progress.

Our democratic transition will continue. But it needs more time, stability and dialogue in order to fully achieve its objectives – freedom, dignity and development. In this context, it is the responsibility of political parties to enhance their contribution to public governance, to understand society's problems, to provide appropriate solutions to Tunisian women and men, and to improve their standard of living, especially vulnerable and marginalized groups and deprived regions.

#### **EXECUTIVE & LEGISLATIVE UPDATES**

Racial Discrimination Law – With the support of Ennahdha, the Tunisian parliament passed the "Elimination of All Forms of Racial Discrimination" Act on October 9. This law criminalizes racial abuse and discrimination against Tunisia's ethnic minorities, especially the 10–15 percent of Tunisians who identify as black. Those convicted of racist speech will face one month of prison time and a fine of \$350, while incitement to racial hatred, racist threats or membership of a racist organization carries a prison sentence of between one and three years, and fines of \$185–\$1,110.

Human Rights Authority - The Tunisian parliament have also fulfilled a major promise of the 2014 constitution by unanimously approving the establishment of an official human rights authority. Under the Basic Law approved on Tuesday, October 16, the rights commission will have a nine-member board chosen by parliament, including two judges, a lawyer, a doctor, three psychologists and two members of civil society organizations.

<u>Cabinet Reshuffle</u> - On November 6, Prime Minister Youssef Chahed announced a proposed cabinet reshuffle, subject to the approval of Parliament. On November 12, Parliament approved the following Ennahdha members to the following positions:

- · Ms. Sayida Ounissi as Minister of Employment and Vocational Training
- Mr. Habib Debbabi as Secretary of State for SMEs in the Ministry of Employment and Vocational Training
- Mr. Ahmed Gaaloul as Secretary of State of Youth and Sports in the Ministry of Sports
- Ms. Besma Jebali as Secretary of State in the Ministry of Local Government and the Environment
